Peggy Bell: A Life of Faithful Service in Ministry

Growing up, Peggy Bell didn't have much. She and her grandmother scraped by, but Peggy has nothing but good memories from her childhood. Her grandmother was a godly woman who set an example by sitting at the table every day, reading and studying God's Word. Peggy recalls being at her church in Spartanburg every time the doors were open, even though they had no car. Peggy looks back on the day she dedicated her life to Christ with fond remembrance. Her grandmother taught her sign language so that they could sign messages to each other during church. For several weeks before her decision, people had consistently responded to the pastor's invitations in his sermons. On one particular Sunday, no one went to the altar. Peggy felt like she was supposed to respond that Sunday. As the congregation sang "Have Thine Own Way, Lord," Peggy remembers signing to her grandmother, "I'm going." There, at twelve years old, she publicly professed her faith in Jesus before the church.

One of Peggy's favorite memories about the church and school she attended growing up is that she was treated like everybody else. Just because she lived with her grandmother instead of her parents, her peers at school and church members

loved her just the same. Every week, the pastor of her church and a deacon visited Peggy and her grandmother in their home. Together, they would just sit and talk. After Sunday services, the people in the church lined up to shake the pastor's hand. Peggy remembers that each time she shook his hand, he pulled her aside and hugged her with one arm while continuing to shake hands. She doesn't know why he did this, but it impacted her life nonetheless. No one ever made her feel different because of her family situation, and she will always be grateful for that. After working for the state for 13 years, Peggy and her husband, Preston, moved to Taylors in 1977. Two years later, Peggy took a job at Taylors First Baptist because it was close to her house, where she, her husband, and her two children cared for her great-aunt. She worked for Phil Hargrove in Administration Education. Peggy remarks she and Phil did just about everything from missions to Sunday School to overseeing the facilities.

Peggy was drawn to Taylors FBC because of the welcoming environment. She recalls thinking as Phil Hargrove gave the welcome one Sunday, "I could come here. I felt at home. I felt welcomed." She worked at Taylors FBC for 22 years full-time and an additional 4 years part-time. On one occasion, Peggy helped organize the church facilities for an event with 3,000 women in attendance. After retiring, Peggy continues to stay involved in the church. She has served through Guest Services and the Funeral Committee, where she serves as the chairperson of the Cemetery Committee. She is also involved with the Mission House ministry. Peggy enjoys participating in a "hands-on" type of ministry. She loves serving others and showing them the love of Christ through her actions.

When asked who has shaped her faith the most, Peggy points to Ruth and Russell Ashmore, her neighbors. She remembers them as good, honest Christians. "They lived what they said they were," she states. Other influential couples in Peggy's life

are Ann and Joe Henson and Larry and Nell Copeland. When people don't hide anything and are upfront about who they are, Peggy says that what they say and do "sticks in your head." In the years she's been a member, Peggy has seen Taylors FBC go through seasons of significant loss and great growth. One of her favorite things about the church is the multigenerational aspects of the congregation. When she sees parents with children or young people in the church, she says, "It thrills me to death to see. I love to be a part of it."

Peggy encourages members at Taylors FBC and young people in the church to go with the flow as the church grows and changes. "Don't let yourself get bogged down if things happen that you don't really agree with. Speak up if you need to, but go on, and don't give up on your church."

Jamestown, NC

It was an exciting stateside South Asian mission trip! Because of your Generous Giving, eleven volunteers built relationships with children and youth from the Burmese (Myanmar) Church on the Life Community Church campus in Jamestown, NC.

The younger students heard Bible stories from the Old Testament about Creation, the Fall and God's plan to redeem His people, Noah and the Great Flood, the Tower of Babel, and Abraham. They also participated in arts and crafts, including puppet and flower making, rainbow mosaics, and story bracelets. The week concluded with the younger students performing a puppet show for parents and guests.

The older students participated in a discipleship study entitled "Who is Jesus." They learned who God says Jesus is, Jesus in the Old Testament, what eyewitnesses say Jesus is, and who Jesus says He is. Older students also participated in a music class daily.

Both groups enjoyed soccer, pickleball, badminton, basketball, and other hands-on game instruction throughout the week. Most of all, seeds were planted in the hearts and minds of these young people We pray that God will continue to bless the work done and use it for His glory and to spread the Good News among these people.

Alaska

Alaska brings to mind cold weather, deep snow, towering mountains, and long winter nights. The cold dark winters are contributing factors to higher rates of suicide and drug/alcohol abuse among the people of Alaska, with suicide being the leading cause of death amongst Alaska teens. That combined with a population of less than 25% Evangelical Christians leads to a culture searching and longing for hope. But for a few months each year, the snow melts (mostly) away, the sun shines longer, and the people of Alaska enjoy the warmth and hope that light brings.

The team of 16 from Taylors had the privilege of working with the Bodolosky Family and Fireweed Ministry to share the hope we have in Christ with more than 40 children and teens at 2 different parks in Anchorage and Sutton, Alaska. Each day, through games, crafts, and Bible study, we were able to show how God's plan unfolds from Genesis to Revelation; a story of hope, peace and harmony with God the creator through Jesus Christ.

In John, Jesus said, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness but will have the light of life." The highlights of our week were not the beautiful landscapes, porcupines, bears, moose, or snow, although these were in abundance. We were privileged to see two young men move from death to life, from despair to hope, and from darkness to light as they surrendered their lives to Christ. Just as the sun penetrates the dark winter months bringing hope and light to Alaska, these two now have the peace of the God of hope through the Light of the World.

Los Angeles

Our time in LA is not something I will soon forget. It's been many years since I've been able to go on a mission trip, and our time in Los Angeles was like water for my soul. From the moment we landed, we hit the ground running and jumped right into ministering to individuals in need alongside our partners with Send Relief. As I watched both the workers and our students minister to those hurting, the stories in the gospel of Mark came alive. Jesus brought hope and life to many afflicted with disease or tormented by demons; He is still doing that today! God uses the workers of Send Relief LA to reach people often underserved by the church. It was a great reminder that we, too, can live on mission with intentionality and reach those around us living in bondage. The students stepped outside their comfort zones into spaces where people are hurting, looked people in the eye, said their names, carried on conversations, and prayed for them in the powerful name of Jesus. I watched the students change as we walked the streets of LA—catching a bigger vision of God's work, His people, and the many ways He could use them in the future. I've personally had beautiful conversations with my daughter since our return. Our trip to LA opened my eyes to brokenness in LA, but more importantly made me more aware of the brokenness we encounter each day. The church planters and missionaries in LA have true servants' hearts, and it was so inspiring and encouraging to minister with them. One of my favorite parts of the trip was being able to connect and worship with the LA Mission Church and their pastor, Min Le, and his family. We were able to participate in their youth night and prayer walk throughout the community. The pastor's boldness and intentionality to go out and form relationships with the entire neighborhood was incredible to witness. I realized through this trip that I really took for granted all the opportunities we have to worship with fellow believers, but also the need for us to go out and minister to those in our neighborhoods here in Taylors. — Jenny Pierce, Leader LA was an experience unlike any other for me. I've been on plenty of student choir trips where we ministered to kids and held many camps, but LA was far from this. In LA we engaged with homeless, poor, and needy individuals who were struggling to get by. Many of them were so used to living on the street that they didn't want to get off, despite the fact that services are available to get them the help they need. Being in Skid Row was tough because the entire street was filled with homelessness, and I didn't know what to do at first. I tried engaging with people, but I didn't know what to say. Eventually, I was able to speak to a man who had been a part of a gang and had his vocal cords cut out. I could see the pain he was experiencing but he still seemed to be joyous. Through this, I saw God working in this man because even when he was at his lowest, God was still providing the man with joy and peace amidst the circumstances. In another instance, we got to minister at a food pantry, and I could just see the desperation in these people's eyes. I saw God working here by providing these people a meal when they needed it most, no matter what they have done in the past; God showed His mercy by continuing to provide for these people. Overall, I was able to see God move in many ways I haven't seen before in LA, and it was an experience I'll never forget. — Jackson Davis, Student

This summer, we launched our first Establish Network Internship program. Because of your Generous Giving, seven college students spent their summer learning about what it looks like to work in ministry, specifically working with Taylors Children, Taylors Students, Taylors College, Reach, and Communications.

Three interns shared their experiences this summer and what they learned: Faith Ensley serving with Taylors Children, Parker Mallard serving with Taylors College, and Laura-Caroline Atkinson serving with Reach.

What did you expect to learn coming into this internship?

Faith: At the beginning of the summer, I was hopeful that this internship would clarify the calling I feel the Lord has placed on my life. I also wanted to grow in boldness to proclaim the gospel, my capacity to study Scripture, and my ability to take feedback from others and implement that feedback to enhance an aspect of ministry. More specifically, I was hopeful to be able to elicit feedback to grow a Special Needs ministry at Taylors FBC.

Parker: I expected to learn how to lead college-aged students better. I also expected to do some handy work to improve the Loft and the surrounding area.

Laura-Caroline: I entered this internship expecting to learn more about what mission-centered ministry looked like, specifically in our church and the local community.

What have you actually learned?

Faith: This internship has grown and stretched me in ways that I never knew were possible, but I am so grateful for all of them. I feel as if I have learned an immense amount about how to clearly communicate with those around me (whether it be ministers, peers, families, other churches, etc.). I have grown in my ability to talk to others, and specifically how to boldly proclaim all that the Lord is doing (and has done) in my life to those around me.

Parker: I have learned how to handle money better in the ministry world. I have also learned that ministry is not all about leading one big group. Ministry can be as simple as taking a student to lunch and mentoring them; it is not always a big group at church.

Laura-Caroline: I have learned what I'd hoped to learn and so much more. Not only have I learned what evangelism looks like in our community but also globally in various avenues from women's ministry to refugee work. I was exposed to distinct ministries within niches and more large-scale organizations.

How has this internship shaped the way you view your calling?

Faith: Throughout this internship, I feel as if I have realized two things: one, I am right where the Lord wants me to be. He has confirmed in more ways than I can count that He has called me to ministry, specifically special needs/disability ministry. I know that this internship was a stepping stone to wherever the Lord is going to lead me next, and I absolutely cannot wait for the next step. Secondly, the Lord has reminded me of the importance of obedience when it comes to listening to His voice. I almost did not apply for this internship, but after many around me encouraged me to do so, I finally did. I pray I never lose sight of the importance of following where He leads, even when it doesn't make sense.

Parker: This internship has given me more hope and a stronger desire for ministry. I still do not know exactly where God wants me in ministry, but after working with college students, I could see myself there.



Laura-Caroline: This summer, I felt God confirming my calling into ministry, specifically in missions. He did this by allowing me to meet specific people with the knowledge and connections to help me find what I wanted to do. I felt energized, passionate, and excited when learning about Refugee Ministry, which was something I'd only briefly considered before. Several times this past summer, I have been brought to tears because of the fierce desire I have to serve and contribute to this call. I ended up applying for the IMB Journeyman Program because of the conversations and connections I made, which I can only see as God's hand leading me and directing my steps. Even if this path doesn't lead me to where I'm expecting it, I know that I am supposed to be walking down it, and I'm excited to see where it leads.

What did you do during your internship?

Faith: Throughout my internship, I was able to shadow all of the Taylors Children team and see a lot of the behindthe-scenes things that go into ministry. I also had the opportunity to begin networking with churches around us that have thriving special needs ministries in hopes of following in their footsteps.

Parker: I planned events for the college group, such as group hikes, ultimate frisbee, and weekly Bible studies. I also helped improve the Loft and learned more about ministry.



Laura-Caroline: I did two main tasks throughout the summer: preparing and organizing the Refugee Care Package and connecting with Taylors FBC's partners to create prayer guides based on those experiences.

What has this internship taught you about God, yourself, or the world around you?

Faith: This internship has taught me so much, but I think the overarching lesson I have learned is to trust the Lord wherever He leads because there is always purpose behind His plans. I have dreamed of working in a church large enough to sustain a special needs ministry for a long time. For a while, I thought this was just a dream, but the Lord has shown me through this summer that there is both an



incredible need and opportunity for this everywhere, including in our area. I do not know where He will take me next, but I plan to cling to His Word and continue to pursue the calling He has placed on my life by following wherever He may lead.

Parker: This internship has taught me to be patient with the Lord's direction as I rely on Him to lead me. I struggle with patience, and so through this summer, the Lord has been pushing me to overcome it.

Laura-Caroline: More than anything, I've been reminded how big and impossible the needs are in the world, but that God isn't limited by mortal impossibilities. His plans are perfect, detailed, and exhaustive, and I don't have to worry about any of them. He's given me the next step, even if that looks like what I do in the next 60 seconds, or if I'm lucky the next hour. Meeting the needs of this community and the world as a whole



is impossible, and yet so much is getting done, not just because of the hard work of Christ-following believers, but mainly because of the divine providence and over-arching design God has. The need is overwhelming; God's perfection is even more so.
