Worship at Taylors

Why worship?

Because we are commanded in scripture to worship!

1 Chronicles 16:29 says "Ascribe to the Lord the glory due his name; bring an offering and come before him.

Worship the Lord in the splendor of his holiness."

Is worship for us or for God?

The answer is both! God wants fellowship with us – He gave the ultimate sacrifice in Jesus, His Son, in order to restore the relationship between God and man that was broken by sin. He delights in our praises. But worship is also for us. It helps us to gain perspective on life, to understand the greatness of God, and our need for Him. We were created to worship!













Why do we sing as part of worship?

Singing is an activity of worship that is found throughout the scriptures, especially in the Psalms. Repeatedly we are admonished to "Sing a new song to the Lord!" (Psalm 96). Singing involves breathing. Our voice is a creation of God. God put a book of songs right in the middle of our Bible, to help us express our heart to Him – our joy and our sorrow and everything in between.

Why do we read scripture together in worship?

Because God speaks to us through His word, and we want to hear from Him, even before we sing our songs and pray our prayers. God is initiator of worship. We respond to His words in praise, thanksgiving, and joy.

Why do we have worship leaders?

We have people who are given gifts to teach, to lead, to share hospitality, to carry the Gospel, to care for the poor and needy. These leaders in our church use their gifts for the good of the Church and for the glory of God. The same is true for those who sing and play instruments and communicate through the tool of music. In the scriptures we find the tribe of Levi who were given the role of worship leadership in the Old Testament. Our singers, choirs, bands, and orchestra fulfill that same role at our church. They are not there to bring glory to themselves, but to point the people to God. The biggest "choir" at Taylors FBC is the congregation. One of our most important questions in evaluating worship services is, "did the people sing?" The worship leaders are there to prompt YOU to join in the worship of our AUDIENCE – The Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

Why do we have three different worship services on Sunday mornings?

How can I deepen my worship encounter each week?

When you come to a worship service, enter into the experience with your whole heart. If the song is unfamiliar, read the words and meditate. If you know the song, join in singing! Read the word of God with both your head and your



heart. Give attention to the preaching, and allow the Spirit of God to guide your thoughts. Pray fervently. Give your tithes and offerings as an act of worship.

In His encounter with the Samaritan woman at the well, Jesus said, "God is spirit, and those who worship him must worship in spirit and truth." In worship we must engage our minds with the truth of God, giving Him our attention and our focus as He speaks to us from His word. And we must also engage our hearts, our spirit, with the Spirit of God, offering our deepest affection and adoration to Him. We worship with our head and with our heart, in truth and in spirit. Learn to be a worshiper – to know God, to love God, and to praise Him for Who He is and for what He has done for us. — Kevin Batson, Worship Pastor





Meet the Matthews* Family!

We would love for you to meet the Matthews Family who are staying in one of our mission houses here at Taylors FBC. They arrived in December after serving an almost four-year term in the Deaf Affinity.

Corman is originally from Tampa, FL, but moved to the upstate his sophomore year of high school. He went on to NGU where he took an American Sign Language (ASL) class. He already had a passion to share the gospel, so when he heard that around the world only 2% of Deaf people know Christ, his heart was moved. During his senior year at NGU, he met Stephanie.

Stephanie had returned from working with the Deaf in South Asia. When she was young, her church had a ministry to the Deaf, which had birthed a burden in her heart, prompting her to major in ASL at Gardner Webb. And well, the rest is history. Corman and Stephanie married, started working at the SC School for the Deaf and the Blind and then found their way, by God's providence, to Senegal, having been sent out by the IMB to work among the Deaf peoples there.

Senegal is predominantly an Islamic country, though at its root, whether one follows Islam or Catholicism, the people are bound in animism. Looking to witch doctors and sorcery for protection from spirits, the people need Jesus! Corman and Stephanie learned different types of sign language to share Him with lost Deaf and to train believers in Bible stories. While Corman had many opportunities to share with a Deaf soccer team, Stephanie spent time among village Deaf women, who were oppressed, abused and neglected.

Would you pray for the lost Deaf who have "heard" the gospel through sign language — that God would call it up in their hearts and they would believe? Would you pray for believing Deaf to be bold in sharing their faith and the stories they have learned? May God do a great work among the Deaf in Senegal!

We look forward to having the Matthews family here throughout 2025 as they prepare to return to Senegal in December! They will be sharing with our children's ministry on March 5. If you would like to have them share in your Life Group or ministry area, please contact the Reach Office!



UUPGs... What are they? And why do we pray?

An UUPG is an Unengaged Unreached People Group

The red on the portion of the world map above indicates where UUPGs can be found. Where do you see the greatest concentration of Unengaged Unreached People Groups?

If you said South Asia, you are right! The South Asia Affinity is comprised of seven nations — Pakistan, India, Nepal, Bangladesh, Bhutan, Maldives, and Sri Lanka.

Patrick Johnstone in The Future of the Global Church, says, "The greatest challenge for world evangelization is presented probably by the peoples of the South Asian affinity bloc. It has more unevangelized individuals and people groups than any other region of the world, and yet in some segments of its societies the Church is growing vigorously. Its ethnic, linguistic, religious and social complexity defies easy description. Overshadowing all is the pervasive caste system that blights India and Nepal especially. The people clusters that comprise South Asian Peoples are based mainly on ethnic origin, language and (to an extent) religion. It is helpful to see the sub-continent in this way, but a three-dimensional model that also incorporates caste is needed. (p. 126)

This is why Taylors First Baptist has made an effort to specifically target South Asia. It doesn't mean other places aren't important. They are! But we also recognize that while South Asia has the greatest concentration of lostness on the planet, it also receives the smallest percent of laborers to population.

What can you do to see UUPGs come to faith?

PRAY! There are cards with the name of an UUPG on the Reach Table near the coffee bar. Pray individually. Pray as a family. Pray in your Life Group. Pray with other believers here at Taylors FBC every first Sunday, either at 9:15 am or 11:00 am in the Chapel.

WHAT IS A PEOPLE GROUP?

An ethno-linguistic group with a common self-identity that is shared by the various members. For strategic purposes it is the largest group within which the Gospel can spread without encountering barriers of understanding or acceptance.



WHY ARE THEY UNREACHED?


A people group is considered unreached (UPG) when there is no indigenous community of believing Christians able to engage this people group with church planting. Technically speaking, the percentage of evangelical Christians in this people group is less than 2 percent.




WHO ARE THE UNENGAGED?

Unreached people groups are unengaged (UUPG) when there is no church planting strategy, consistent with evangelical faith and practice, under way. Gathering believers and planting churches are the keys to establishing an effective and multiplying presence among these people groups.


