Regeneration Student Choir: Mission Trip to New Orleans

Thanks so much for praying for the Student Choir as we ministered and served in New Orleans in June. We could feel your prayers!

We worked each day through the "Mission Lab" at New Orleans Seminary. Our team of 32 students was divided in thirds. Each group had a morning assignment and an afternoon assignment.

In each of these areas, students not only worked hard, but had conversations of encouragement for those leading the ministries, and conversations about the Lord with those they met. They were encouragers, witnesses, and ambassadors for Jesus. You should be proud of them. Diann Greer and all our leaders were awesome as well, working right beside the students in every ministry.

Pray for those we ministered to. Several folks who are fighting addiction come to mind – one guy I met had been clean for 30 days the day we talked, and had come to Christ at the very end of his recent incarceration. Through tears he asked that I pray that he would be strong this time and not relapse. So many stories like this! Pray for



the churches we worked with – many with the same problems we face, but in a place where both Catholicism and an “anything goes spirituality” are prevalent.

Each evening we had a service of worship and preaching, and then met in our teams to debrief. Long but fruitful days.

Thanks again for your prayers – we traveled 1700 miles with no problems, no sickness, no real issues. God is good!



Some of the ministries we were a part of:

- Excite All-Stars – non-profit day care program, where we hosted a full VBS and continued to help in the afternoon
- New Orleans Mission – drug addiction ministry, including a year long intensive discipleship program (currently there are 500+ men and women in the program); we worked in the pantry, clothing area, kitchen, and we sang for the daily worship service to over 60 men
- Bethel South Ministry – drug addiction ministry, providing jobs and therapy for men and women; we sorted clothes and assisted in the car wash, both of which provide funding for the program and income for those in it
- Baptist Friendship House – ministry to homeless people, provided clothing, helped organize clothing donations, worked in the kitchen, fed over 150 homeless people
- Parkside Baptist – we distributed hundreds of VBS flyers door-to-door in their neighborhood, with many good conversations about the church and the Lord
- Vintage Church – we assisted in clean-up from their recent VBS ministry and helped refurbish their children’s area, also assisted with their food distribution program
- Evangelism – teams walked in the City Park area and in the French Quarter, praying, asking people for prayer requests, and having gospel conversations
- Habitat for Humanity – volunteered in the Restore, and had conversations with patrons
- Food Bank – made over 1000 sandwiches to help feed people across Mississippi and Louisiana
- Urban Farms – community garden, helping to feed the poor
- Rebuild Ministries – helping to provide and improve housing for the poor

Vacation Bible School 2025 was Amazing!

We had nearly 400 children and over 150 volunteers on campus *magnifying the bigness of God in the smallest of things*. The children learned about how God sees them, cares about them, loves them, forgives them and how He keeps His promises. We had incredible missionary speakers who shared about where they serve, who they serve, and the various experiences they've had with sharing the gospel around the world. Our mission project this year was to raise money to have 1 and 2 Thessalonians translated for the Arbore people group in Ethiopia. Our goal was \$5,000 but families went above and beyond to raise over \$7,111! We are so thankful for all the amazing volunteers who gave of their time to serve at VBS! The Lord was gracious and faithful to provide a smooth and joyful week as we shared our love for Jesus.

Moms Mentoring Moms

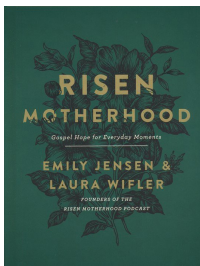
Moms Mentoring Moms is for young moms and is an opportunity to gain spiritual and emotional encouragement and social connections. We want to encourage, equip, and challenge moms to apply the gospel to their everyday lives. Our prayer is that through this community of moms, your growth as a mom has a ripple effect seen throughout all areas of your life.

Wednesdays at 9:00 am in the Fellowship Hall, beginning September 10

Meet for 10 weeks, take a holiday break, and start back on January 6 for another 10 weeks.

Session Details: Moms Mentoring Moms meeting typically includes various styles of practical and biblical teaching, fun activities, input from mentor moms, and, most importantly, you'll get to have real conversations with other moms who understand the joys and frustrations of motherhood. We finish each semester with a Celebration Brunch.

Curriculum: Year two of *Risen Motherhood* by Emily Jensen and Laura Wifler. Motherhood is hard. One second, we think we're doing a good enough job; the next, we feel like the worst mom on the



planet. Which is why we need the refreshing truth of the gospel to be repeated over and over again, giving us hope in the everyday moments. What does the gospel have to do with birth, education choices, self-care, relationships, and body image? We will look

through the lens of the gospel and see scripture has everything to do with the way we think through all of our parenting challenges, big and small.

Childcare: Available for birth through 5th grade with registration.

Cost: \$25 for the two semester program, including fall and winter. This fee covers the practical expenses for both semesters such as childcare, work booklet, and the end-of-the-semester brunches. *The Risen Motherhood* book is not included in the fee but recommended that you purchase on your own.

Bible Study

Women's Bible Study is for women of all ages. It is an opportunity for you to be encouraged to read God's Word daily, grow in your knowledge of who God is, and know what His Word says. We will deeply dive into a portion of scripture and apply what we learn to our everyday lives.

Tuesdays at 6:30 pm in the Student Worship Room, beginning September 9

Wednesdays at 9:00 am in the Fellowship Hall, beginning September 10

Session Details: The 10-week Bible Study meeting typically includes fellowship, biblical teaching, input from table discussion leaders, and, most importantly, you'll get to have discussion with others and grow in God's Word and spiritual maturity together. Moms will participate in their own peer-led discussion group. Online attendees will participate in the large group time and then have virtual table time with other women.

Curriculum: *Behold and Believe, A Bible Study on the "I Am" statements of Jesus* by Courtney Doctor and Joanna Kimbrel. Seeing is believing. If we want to know more about Jesus and why He is important to our lives, we need to take a closer look at what He says about Himself. Jesus describes Himself as the bread of life, the light of the world, the good shepherd, and more. His bold words invite us to behold Him and then to trust Him. Come and explore the question of Who is Jesus? Using Jesus's I AM statements in the Gospel of John.



Childcare: Available for birth through 5th grade on Wednesdays with registration.

Cost: \$10 for the semester for in-person Bible study. This fee covers practical expenses for the semester.

Moms & Work

Moms & Work is for all moms. All moms have a calling to fulfill and a contribution to offer in kingdom work. We want to encourage, equip, and challenge moms with practical wisdom from God's Word. There will be an emphasis on the calling of motherhood no matter your vocation, inside or outside the home. You will have an opportunity to offer and receive emotional and spiritual encouragement as you connect with other moms seeking to walk faithfully in the good work the Lord has given us.



The first Wednesday of each month at 6:15 pm beginning September 3 (Building C Welcome Area)

Session Details: A Moms & Work meeting typically includes fellowship, practical and biblical teaching, input from table moms, and most importantly real conversations with other moms who understand the joys and frustrations of motherhood. We will break up in discussion groups based of the season the Lord currently has you in. Moms will walk away with a challenge each month and some helpful tools to help apply to their everyday lives.

Curriculum: God's Word tells us, "The Fear of the Lord is the beginning of Wisdom." We will look at Proverbs 31 and take one verse each month. You will be given a booklet that will be a guide for each month and offer additional resources to go deeper. A helpful resource for this year will be *Habits of the Household* by Justin Whitmel Earley.

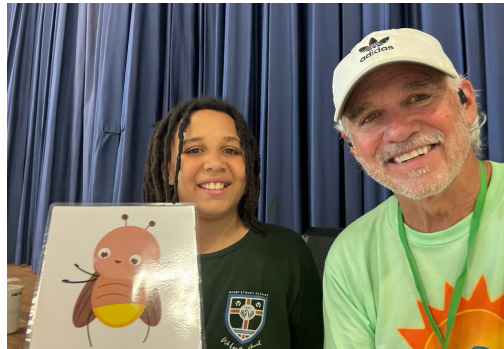
Generosity Moment

They are both passionate about sharing the gospel and making disciples. **Eshan wants to take part in getting the gospel to every village in his country

Story: One evening, Steven and I had some time to spare and decided to prayer walk and look for opportunities to share the gospel. As we were walking, we made eye contact with two Buddhists, who ended up stopping and having a conversation with us. Steven began to share the gospel, explaining our need for Christ. A person



overheard our conversation and asked to join, so we gladly accepted him. The brother who joined the conversation began to ask many questions, so Steven continued talking with the monks while I started discussing with **Johnny. When sharing with **Johnny, he shared how hopeless he was. We explained that the hope Christ gives us is our greatest hope. Later, he decided to place his faith in Christ and is now being disciplined. The monks were also able to hear the gospel message for the first time. Steven and I were excited to witness a brother come to faith.

Continue to pray for the kingdom to be advanced in South Asia. It is exciting to see the kingdom growing, but there is still much work to be done.

TRIP REPORT

Serve and Share Los Angeles

The city of Los Angeles is home to approximately 3.7 million people, with an estimated 45,000 of these being homeless. On the other side of the glamour and fame of Hollywood, are thousands who have been forgotten by society. This summer, a team of 9 was sent out from Taylors to share hope to the hopeless and be the hands and feet of Jesus.

As soon as we arrived in the city, we joined the team from Send Relief and Purpose LA to share water and the Gospel message with people living in MacArthur Park. Many did not speak English, but we still shared what we had with those who would talk with us.

Throughout the rest of the week, we used a variety of service opportunities to open the door for Gospel conversations. We planted a vegetable garden in a low-income apartment complex, and we cooked and served dinner at the San Fernando Valley Rescue Mission. There was also an opportunity to lead a children's program at one of the Send Relief Ministry Centers. On the last day, we walked the streets of Skid Row, inviting people to worship and enjoy a meal with us at the Fred Jordan Mission. Those who came heard David tell his story and share the hope he has in Jesus Christ.

We wrapped up our time in LA with a time of prayer on the rooftop overlooking the city. Each of us carried with us the names and faces of those we engaged during the week. Our prayer is that the Lord was glorified through our words and actions, and that the seeds of the Gospel will sprout in the hearts of the 200+ names we prayed over.
