Did you know?

Most of those visiting with us on a Sunday will decide within 7 minutes of arriving on our campus if they will return to Taylors FBC for a second time! That means that for many, they have made this decision before Worship begins, before the Word is taught, or before their children are checked in.

Our Guest Services Team strives to make every second count. From Parking Lot to Pew, our team is ready to welcome and serve new and familiar faces. This also means that it is important for each of our church members to practice hospitality culture, too!



Have you thought about it this way?

Those that come through our doors are a mission opportunity. We never know what someone is going through when they step on our campus. Each Sunday, we must earnestly pray and anticipate that "today could be the day of salvation for many!" Our hospitality and compassion must extend beyond our Guest Services Team; each church member is called to be an ambassador for Christ inside our church walls and outside our church walls. Take time to reflect on how you engage with unfamiliar faces on Sunday mornings.



Hospitality Culture Within our Church

Hospitality extends far beyond those wearing a Guest Services lanyard or badge on a Sunday morning. We cannot allow our thinking to be that hospitality is only the job of a few, and not the job of all. As followers of Christ, we are called to be hospitable to those we encounter, taking every opportunity to extend love, compassion, and generosity to those we meet that Christ may be made known and be glorified. Every time we gather as a church, we have the opportunity to show others the love of Christ. That should both excite us and fuel us for the task at hand.

Making sure that those who are on our campus feel welcomed, seen, and valued must be a priority for us. A phrase I strive to have our team remember is "how we feel about a guest when they walk in, is how they will feel about our church when they walk out." What does this mean? This statement means that we must do our best to represent Christ and our church well to every single person who walks through our doors because above most things, they will remember how we made them feel as they leave. How do we do this? We must be initiators, seeking out those unfamiliar faces, extending kindness and a helping hand to them. We must be proactive, not reactive; let us not wait for someone to come to us and begin a conversation or ask for help but let us move towards people and conversations with joy. We must make it personal and always be genuine, a generic "good morning" or "how are you?" when you don't truly care about the response is easy to detect.

In a church our size, it can be easy to jump from conversation to conversation, from person to person, but we must fight the urge to speed ahead and choose to be present where our feet are. Each interaction we have on a Sunday morning is an opportunity to encourage one another and spur one another on. You never know what impact your words may have.

We must be knowledgeable; it's harder to help someone when we don't know the answers ourselves. Understanding who we are at Taylors FBC and what we believe so that we can answer questions and share about our church with others stands out to those visiting with us and makes a difference. It shows them, you can care about this place, too, and are bought in. We must be imitators; our hospitality should imitate Christ as much as possible. He, Himself, came not to be served, but to serve. Let that be our goal - not giving up, not growing weary, not seeing Sunday mornings as a time for ourselves, but as a time to serve as Christ served... that He may be known, that He may be glorified, and that many would be saved. Membership is meaningful. Let us as members of Taylors First Baptist, showcase that to those around us.

Equip Institute Seminar: Meaningful Membership

There is a lot of confusion about church membership. Some Christians treat membership as an afterthought. Others assume it is an obligation, but it doesn't really matter. Still others reject the idea of membership altogether. Drawing on New Testament themes, the Baptist tradition understands membership as Christ-centered, covenantal, and commissioned.

In this Equip Institute Seminar, we will look at the Scriptures and Baptist history as we discuss why meaningful membership is part of God's design for every Christian, and why it matters for our church.

The Gathering — Growth within Taylors College ministry has been an encouraging sight. The Gathering continues to meet during the Fall semester where students and young adults bring their Bibles and join together for a time of worship and teaching. Alex has been teaching through a sermon series specifically targeting the questions like; what is my role as a believer, what is my purpose in this season, what is my story and how to write your personal testimony. Seeing students make time out of their week to attend this Gathering demonstrates a hunger for growing in the God's word and community. Guests continually arrive week after week where they are met by a college serve team and followed up with. This student involvement has been one of several contributing factors rise in connection.



Big Breakfast — Taylors College continues to host our monthly "Big Breakfast" one Sunday per month. Our Life Group is joined one of our Adult Life Groups who bring breakfast and join us for the meal. This monthly meal is pivotal to exposing our college students to others within the church. Connections are made and casseroles are devoured, what more can a college student as for? The Adult leaders within Taylors College are a key part to the monthly success. They work behind the scenes to refill coffee, juice, and cups while resupplying napkins, forks, and chairs at each table. Big breakfast is a team effort that they execute flawlessly. Teach. Reach. Beach.

Teach Reach Beach is a weekend event our college minister, Alex Smith, offers during the Fall Semester along with 5 additional churches across the Carolinas. The goal? To see church-based college ministries collaborate with a church in a South Carolina coastal town so that they may evangelize the area, prayer walk, and point those they encounter back to that local church.

The schedule included large group sessions, Saturday morning breakouts, evangelism training, and most importantly—time in the harvest. One of our Establish Network Interns, Chapel Leroy, led a breakout Saturday morning on Relational Ministry from a Students Perspective. Chapel is a student at North Greenville University and is a Christian Studies major.

One of the most memorable moments came at the end of our evangelism training when a young man, in the training, prayed to receive Christ as Lord and Savior. What a joy! Unbeknownst to us, the momentum was just beginning. At 4:30 that afternoon we gathered near the pier on Folly Beach and baptized our new brother in the faith. While celebrating, 6 more young adults came forward to be baptized, publicly identifying with Christ and acknowledging their salvation in him alone.

Two of the young adults that came forward were beach goers observing the first baptism. As they came forward into the water, Alex and Todd Williams (First Baptist Spartanburg) heard their salvation story. Both had accepted Christ in previous months but had not found a church to be baptized in. Once they were baptized, Alex asked where they were from. They both were vacationing for the weekend and were from Conway. As the Lord would have it, one of our partnering churches is in Conway and ministers at the school the young lady attends, Coastal Carolina University. Alex and Todd were able to connect the two with PJ (college minister in Conway) right there on the shoreline. PJ gathered their names and numbers and has been in contact with them, invited them to church and began discipleship efforts.



With that momentum in mind, we were expectant for Sunday service with our local partnering Church, Fort Johnson Baptist Church on James Island. The Lord blessed again as there was standing room only while members and guests pulled seats into the foyer of the church to worship.

God is good.

These are just a few stories of how walking in obedience honors the Lord and encourages our hearts.



ONE Night



As a city leader in missions work, Boss has developed strategic partnerships and empowered local leaders to engage their local communities. Boss previously served as vice president of global training at Meridian, where he led work in gospel advance through international church-leader training and the production of theological resources. He earned a bachelor's degree from Southwest Baptist University in Bolivar, Missouri, and a master's degree from Luther Rice University in Lithonia, Georgia. The Bosses have four children.

Unengaged Unreached People Group

An Unengaged Unreached People Group (UUPG) is a distinct people group (ethnicity) that is less than 2% evangelical Christian with no known efforts to engage them with Gospel proclamation, disciple-making and church planting strategies. There are around 3,000 UUPGs remaining in the world today. The Bible is clear in presenting the desire of God's heart to redeem people from every nation, language and tribe. It also explicitly pictures a coming day when representatives from every people group will gather around the throne in worship of the Lamb (Rev. 7:9). To bring this to fulfillment, one of the remaining tasks of the church is to mobilize laborers to engage the remaining UUPGs of the world. Until all people groups have heard, the Church must continue to pray, go and send!

Prayer Requests

1. Pray for laborers – Ask God to raise up churches and individuals to go and engage UUPGs (Luke 10:2).
2. Pray for open hearts – Pray that God would soften the hearts of people in UUPGs to be receptive to the gospel message.
3. Pray for access and resources – Pray for open doors to difficult places, Scripture translation, and the development of discipleship tools.

UUPG Prayer Meeting

We have the responsibility and the privilege to intercede with the Father on behalf of these image-bearers who have never heard the Gospel.

Kambar

The Kambar are a Hindu, unengaged, unreached people group found in the southern districts of Tamil Nadu. They number about 36,000 converse in Tamil, and are also known in some areas as the Oochan. They serve primarily as temple priests and use the drum and songs of praise to invoke their gods.

Pray that these people, who both perform animal sacrifices and have a symbolic giving away of the bride at weddings, would hear that God gave away His only son, Jesus Christ. Pray that they would understand that, "God presented Christ as a sacrifice of atonement, through the shedding of His blood – to be received through faith" (Romans 3:25)... that Christ's blood paid the penalty for their sins once and for all. Pray as they hear this news that they would believe it through faith and as a result enter into an eternal relationship with the Father.


Month of Impact: Every Member on Mission!

the peoples! — Psalm 96:1-3*


As followers of Christ, we long to see a great multitude from every nation, tribe, people, and language knowing and worshipping our Lord Jesus Christ (Revelation 7:9). We long to see God receive the glory that is due His name. Throughout the Month of October, our Life Groups will look at the "Mission of God" and how we all have a role to play in accomplishing His mission. We will look at what the Mission of God is, the missionary task involved in accomplishing this and both our church's role and our individual roles in participating and living out His mission: seeing His glory declared by the nations. We will conclude the month on October 26, gathering as one body in one service as we declare His glory together during Engage Sunday.

Our Church Planting Partners

Los Angeles: We are partnering to reach the greater Los Angeles area by coming alongside church planters who are already on mission in LA. We will pray, invest, encourage and engage the lostness as their partner.

City Population: 3.8 million | County Population: 10 million | "Greater" Los Angeles area Population: 20 million
Home to the largest ethnic, cultural, and language groups in the U.S. | There are 400 different people groups in Los Angeles.
9 out of every 10 people you pass on the street don't know the Gospel.

Myrtle Beach: Our partnership here is two-fold. First, we are seeking to advance the Kingdom of God by partnering with church planters who are seeking to establish new churches. Second, we are striving to assist existing SCBC churches to capitalize on the opportunities to engage the rapidly growing number of unchurched people in their communities.

78 churches | Average worship attendance: 9,000 people (30% decrease since 2012)
Fastest growing city in the U.S. for 3 years straight. | County Population: 450,000
Horry County is projected to be the second largest county in SC by 2042.

New Hampshire: Our focus is to invest in an emerging network of church planters that are focused on multiplying healthy disciples and churches. We desire to encourage, assist and support these planters as they work in a very secular, post-Christian context.

Population: 1.4 million | 92% of the population are unchurched | NAMB has recently established 10 new church plants.
Most churches are small and meeting in makeshift places until they are able to support a location of their own.

North Carolina: Our partnership is focused on helping launch new and grow existing South Asian church plants in the Triad NC area. We will send teams to assist in engaging the South Asian community through community events and sharing the Gospel by demonstrating love through servant evangelism.

Triad Population: 1,733,965 | Triad South Asian Population: 70,000 | 2% of Triad South Asian population are Christians
The Triad area is one of the most ethnically and religiously diverse regions in the country — and historically one of the most helpful to refugees.

South Asia: We are seeking to mobilize and equip the South Asian church to faithfully abide in Christ, share the Gospel with urgency, make disciples and plant churches in the largest concentration of lostness in the world. We are also engaged in the ongoing work of leadership development with local leaders, striving to bring encouragement and renewal to them as they follow their God-given call.

Population: 1,859,169,756 | Total People Groups: 2,688 | 900 + UUPG
1.85% is estimated to be evangelical Christians | 42,881 are dying daily without Christ




