

BIBLE PASSAGE EXODUS 19-20

**Summary:** The Israelites lived in captivity in Egypt for 400 years before God miraculously rescued them. They journeyed towards the Promised Land. God called Moses up to Mount Sinai. God gave Moses laws to show the people how to act toward Him and toward others. These instructions included the Ten Commandments which taught the people how to love God and love other people.

# LEADER TRAINING: BEST PRACTICES FOR CHECK-IN AND CHECK-OUT TIME

A welcoming environment matters greatly for preschoolers and their families. Having a great church check-in/check-out process will set the tone for everything else a family might experience when they visit your church. Always greet every family with a warm, friendly face. Engaging with kids immediately will help them transition into your group. Always double-check every kid's name tag to make sure it is correct, and confirm that new parents know the check-out process. Part of a smooth, organized check-out system is having the kids ready for parent pickup at the end of your time together. Make sure any crafts or papers have the kids' names on them, shoes are on everyone's feet and any personal items are labeled and easily attainable. If you are helping to check out preschoolers, it's important to enforce the policies and procedures consistently. Check every parent's pickup ticket or the item used for parents to pick up their kid even if you personally know them. New parents will notice if it's not consistently enforced. Connect with parents by sharing about the lesson or mentioning something positive their kid did in group time.

# NAVIGATING A BROKEN WORLD: "FOLLOW YOUR HEART"

Today's kids are growing up in a culture where they are encouraged to do whatever feels right to them. The message of current culture is "follow your heart" and "you do you." But our hearts are not trustworthy, and our emotions can lead us down the wrong paths. In today's Bible story, kids will learn that God shows us how life works best. As kids ask questions and wonder why they should follow what God says, encourage them to remember that God is always trustworthy. God is the source of all wisdom. Living for God is the best

#### **SUPPLIES:**

10 wooden blocks, painter's tape, marker

#### PREP

Put a piece of tape on each block and use a marker to write the numbers 1-10, one number per block. Hide the numbered blocks around your space in various spots where kids can find them.

#### **ACTIVITY INTRO:**



Welcome, everyone! My name is \_\_\_\_\_. Can you each tell us your name? Welcome each kid by name and welcome any new kids to the group.

#### **INSTRUCTIONS:**

- 1. **Say:** Today we will use our eyes to hunt and find some blocks! Can you blink your eyes? Now pretend you're putting on goggles with your hands. *Demonstrate making circles with your hands and putting them over your eyes*.
- **2. Say:** I have hidden 10 blocks around our space. We will go around and look for them.
- **3.** Walk around your space with kids to find the blocks. Give clues as needed for where the blocks are hidden.
- **4. Ask:** Was it hard to find all the blocks?
- **5. Ask:** How many blocks did we find? Can you help me put them in order?
- **6.** Help kids put the blocks in numerical order, counting aloud.

#### **ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:**

Today you will hear a story about a man named Moses. God gave him 10 special rules. Let's learn more about today's Bible story together!

#### **ACTIVITY INTRO:**

I loved learning more about everyone! Today we will learn more about a man named Moses. God used Moses in a big way. Let's learn more about it together.

# Bible TEACHING

TEN COMMANDMENTS

#### INTRO:

Play Countdown Video and guide kids to sit together for large group teaching.

#### **WELCOME:**

**Say:** Welcome, everyone! I'm so glad you are here today. Let's jump into our Bible story. But first, does anyone remember what we learned last week? *Allow kids to respond*.

# RECAP FROM Last Week

**Say:** Last week we learned about Joseph, and how he forgave his brothers and helped provide for his family. Show teaching illustration: Joseph and His Brothers (Image 06).

**Say:** Today we will learn a true story from the Bible about the Ten Commandments.

**Say:** Let's take a look at this month's Big Question. Can you help me do a drumroll? Ready? 1, 2, 3 drumroll!

#### **SUPPLIES:**

Bible, teaching slides, teaching pictures (printed/shown from teaching slides), video player, music player, grey poster, scissors (prep), marker, 10 index cards, tape

#### PREP:

Write numbers 1-10 onto an index card, one number per card. Place them in a bin. Cut the poster board into two pieces. Write numbers 1-5 on one poster and numbers 6-10 on the other poster. Loop tape and place next to each number on the posters for kids to place the index card to match up the numbers.

#### **LEADER TIP:**

Though most preschoolers aren't reading yet, many will recognize numbers. Help point out the numbers as kids put the Ten Commandments in order in today's lesson.



Show the Big Question Teaching Image.

**Say:** When can we trust God? We'll find out in the Bible story!

Play the "Find It in the Bible" song.

Hold up a Bible.

**Say:** Who can tell me the name of this book? *Allow kids to respond.* 

**Say:** Yes! This book is called the Bible. The Bible is the most important book of all. The Bible is full of true stories about how God takes care of His people and loves them. Today we will hear a story from the Old Testament in the book of Exodus. The Old Testament is filled with lots of stories about the very beginning, God's creation and His people.





# TEN COMMANDMENTS

#### (EXODUS 19-20)

**Say:** Raise your hand if you have any rules at home. I know I do! *Raise your hand up high.* Can you tell me what some of the rules are? When I count to three, everyone tell me one rule you have at home. Are you ready? One, two, three! *Cup your ear like you're listening.* 

**Say:** Wow! I loved hearing all of those different rules. In today's Bible story, we will learn about when God gave His people a set of rules to live by to help them know how life works best.

**Say:** But first, we have to rewind a little bit! Everyone stand up and spin around as we "rewind!" Great job! Now sit back down.

**Say:** Do you remember learning about Joseph? Joseph stored food for when the food ran out. He helped provide for his family. Joseph's family stayed in Egypt and were called the **Israelites**. Let's fast forward to the next part of the story. Everyone stand up and spin around the other way as we skip ahead to the next part. Now sit back down.

**Say:** The **Israelites** began growing as they had more and more children. They grew bigger and bigger and bigger! Spread your arms out as far as you can.

**Say:** There were so many **Israelites** that the leader of Egypt worried they would take over. So he made them work really hard for 400 years. God sent Moses to help set the **Israelites** free.

**Say:** Moses helped lead the **Israelites** to the edge of the land God had promised Abraham. God had told Abraham he would have as many **descendants**, or family members, as the stars in the sky. Abraham and Sarah had a son named Isaac when they were very old. God was keeping his promise to Abraham!

**Say:** During the **Israelites**' journey to a new land, God spoke to Moses in a thick cloud. God told Moses to remind the **Israelites** how they were rescued from Egypt. They should obey God and always follow Him. When the **Israelites** were told this, they said, "Everything God says, we will do."

**Say:** God told Moses to bring everyone to Mount Sinai three days later. One, two, three! The people were gathered together at the bottom of the mountain. Reach your arms up high above your head like you're a big mountain! God spoke and it sounded like thunder! He called Moses to the top of the mountain.

Show teaching illustration: Mount Sinai (Image 07).





**Say:** Let's pretend to climb up the mountain like Moses did. Can you put one hand above the other? Keep going, keep going! Now go faster and faster! We made it! Moses climbed to the top. There God gave Moses the laws on how the people should live. These were the **Ten Commandments**—10 ways God said to love Him and each other. This helped the people know how life works best.

**Say:** God wrote the **commandments** on two stone tablets—kind of like these grey posters I have here. The **Ten Commandments** were special instructions on what to do and what not to do.

Show teaching illustration: Ten Commandments (Image 08).

**Say:** The **commandments** helped God's people to honor God and know right from wrong. Let's work together to put the numbers 1-10 in order since there were a total of **Ten Commandments.** 

Call up one volunteer at a time to pull out a number card from the bin. Lead them to ask the other kids to help them put the numbers in order from 1-10.

Show teaching illustration: 10 Commandments (Image 08).

#### **POINT TO JESUS:**

**Say:** God loves us so much, He even gave us instructions on how life works best. No one can keep all these commandments. Only God who is perfect can. God sent Jesus to defeat sin and make a way for us to be right with God forever.

**Say:** Let's close in prayer as we wrap up our Bible story time together. Reach your hands up really high.

Reach hands up high.

Say: Now clap them together like this.

Clap hands together.

**Say:** Let's pray.

**Pray:** Dear God, thank You for helping us learn how life works best. Help us to always turn to You when we need directions in life. You are so good and loving. Amen.



# **BIG QUESTION**

Now it's time to answer our Big Question. Can you all help me do a drumroll? 1, 2, 3... drumroll!

Show the Big Question Teaching Image.

Say: When can we trust God? Always!

**Say:** That's right! The Bible teaches us that we can always trust God every day.



### **VERSE VIDEO**

Play Memory Verse Motion Video after the verse is read.

#### **MEMORY VERSE MOTIONS:**

Help kids recite and retain the memory verse by teaching it with motions. Before you teach the verse, be sure to explain what it means.

- Does God love us?


#### **PRAY TOGETHER:**

# THE TWELVE SPIES

BIBLE PASSAGE NUMBERS 13-14

**Summary:** The Israelites reached the land God had promised them. Moses sent 12 scouts to check it out. After exploring, the scouts reported that the land was very good, just like God had said. However, 10 of the spies were scared of the people in the land. Joshua and Caleb proclaimed that the land was good and that the Israelites could take it with God's help. The people trusted the 10 spies and became angry. Since the people didn't trust

God, Joshua and Caleb were the only ones God allowed into the Promised Land. The Israelites wandered in the wilderness for 40 years.

Today's Brite Idea is: God can be trusted.

#### **LEADER TRAINING: POTTY TIME TIPS**

Have you ever felt overwhelmed with preschoolers' potty training and being dropped off in your group? Here are some suggestions for helping them have a successful and hopefully accident-free time in your group! Use label stickers as an additional cue for any kid who is potty training. This is a constant reminder for the leaders in the room to watch the kid for any "potty dancing." If a parent shares their child goes to the bathroom every half hour, set a timer as a reminder. Ask the parents if they have any extra accident clothes or any clothes their kids have out grown to use for potty accident emergencies. If a kid needs assistance, have another leader stand outside the door and monitor the situation. This is the three-person rule so that as an adult, you are never alone with a kid. If a kid needs help or hasn't finished after some time, talk through the door to communicate with them if any help is needed, making sure another leader is with you at all times.

## **NAVIGATING A BROKEN WORLD: DISAGREEMENTS**

Disagreements are common among kids. According to one survey, kids have more than 4,200 arguments with their parents by the time they turn 18.\* Adding in disagreements with siblings, friends and classmates, kids navigate tens of thousands of these situations as they grow up. Disagreements are simply a part of life and may even happen with kids who are in your care. In today's Bible story, kids will learn about a serious disagreement between the Israelites that they were unable to work through because they were

### **PRESCHOOL GLOSSARY:**

**Faithful:** can be trusted. always the same

**Generation:** a group of people born who grow up together

**Trustworthy:** loyal; will do what one says they will do

so focused on their own opinions instead of what God wanted. When kids disagree in your group, help them talk it out and see how God can work through challenging relationships. Always demonstrate for kids that everyone is wanted in the group. As disagreements arise, point kids back to Jesus and help them seek His ways rather than their own.

#### **SUPPLIES:**

#### PREP:

Write an action onto the index cards such as jump, spin around, crouch down and jump up, clap your hands, wiggle, march, etc. Place the index cards into a pile.



#### **ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS:**

Kids with physical limitations can choose the action cards for the group to increase their participation. Be as inclusive as possible with your actions if any kids in the group have this need.

#### **ACTIVITY INTRO:**

The Bible teaches us true stories about God. Today we learned about when the Israelites reached the Promised Land. Moses sent 12 spies to explore this new land, and they found it to be wonderful, just as God had promised.

#### **INSTRUCTIONS:**

- 1. Say: I think the spies had to do all kinds of moves as they spied the land. They probably had to jump over things, take big and small steps, crouch down and more!
- **2. Say:** As we listen to today's Memory Verse Song, we will do different actions along with the song. When the song pauses, I'll pull out an index card and read off what it says. Then we will do that action until the song pauses again!
- **3.** Play and pause the song as you read off the next motion for kids to do.
- **4. Ask:** Can you remember our verse this week?
- **5. Say:** Those who know Your name put their trust in You. (Psalm 9:10)



#### **ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:**

That was a fun way to practice our memory verse! We learned about how the spies saw the land, but then only two of them, Joshua and Caleb, believed God would make a way for them to have the Promised Land. Our memory verse reminds us that we can always trust in God.

## RECAP FROM Last Week

Show teaching illustration: Ten Commandments (Image 06).

**Say:** Today, we will learn a true story from the Bible about the 12 spies who went to see the land God had promised them, but there was a problem. We'll find out more soon!

#### **SUPPLIES:**

Bible, teaching slides, teaching pictures (printed/shown from teaching slides), video player, music player, backpack, backpack supplies (water bottle, snacks, jacket, flashlight, etc.), 5 purple balloons

#### PREP:

Blow up the balloons and hide them within the Bible teaching space.

#### **LEADER TIP:**

In this lesson, kids will go on a spy adventure. Depending on your space, kids can move around the space or do movements standing in place. These movements will help them get their wiggles out and engage with the rest of the Bible story.

**Say:** Let's take a look at this month's Big Question. Can you help me do a drumroll? Ready? 1, 2, 3 drumroll!





Show the Big Question Teaching Image.

**Say:** When can we trust God? Let's find out more in our Bible story!

Play the "Find It in the Bible" song.

Hold up a Bible.

**Say:** Who can tell me the name of this book? *Allow kids to respond.* 

**Say:** Yes! This book is called the Bible. The Bible is the most important book of all. The Bible is full of true stories about how God takes care of His people and loves them. # THE TWELVE SPIES

#### (NUMBERS 13-14)

**Say:** Hold up the backpack. Today we are going on a big adventure! I have this backpack because we will pretend that we are one of the 12 spies who went to see what the Promised Land was like. What do you think we need to pack for this adventure? Allow kids to respond. Add various objects to the backpack, such as a water bottle, snacks, jacket, flashlight, etc.

**Say:** God had promised a man named Abraham he would have many family members—as many as the stars in the sky! God also promised Abraham that he and his family would be given a special land. His family was known as the Israelites. The Israelites had just reached the edge of the Promised Land. God told Moses to send 12 spies into the land to see what it was like and report back.

Show teaching illustration: Spies (Image 07).

**Say:** Are you ready to spy on the land with me? I need everyone to pull out their pretend binoculars. *Hold up your hands to your eyes and look through them.* Let's put on our listening ears. *Tap your ears*.

**Say:** Spies, are you ready? Allow kids to respond. Lead kids by taking big steps; small steps; stop, drop and roll; standing as still as a statue; crouching down low; etc.

**Say:** Look, here are huge grapes! Point to the purple balloons around your space. Who can help me carry these back? Assign kids to help carry them back to their seats. Lead the rest of the kids back to where they were originally sitting. Then collect the "grape" balloons from the kids.

**Say:** That was an awesome adventure! Just like you found these big grapes, the spies also found some big grapes, too. They brought them back to Moses and told him all that they saw. Two of the spies named Joshua and Caleb shared about how good the land was. They said, "The land flows with milk and honey, and the fruit is huge." Everyone clap your hands and cheer! Clap and cheer with the kids.

**Say:** But most of the spies said it would be too hard. The people who lived in the land were very strong and the cities would be hard to overtake. Caleb believed they could take the land. Joshua also encouraged the people to remember what God had promised and that God was always with them.





THE TWELVE SPIES

**Say:** The people didn't listen, and they wanted to find someone to take them back to Egypt where they had come from. They forgot about God's **faithfulness** to keep His promises. Oh no! But God can always be trusted, God is always the same. God said those who didn't believe would not enter the Promised Land. The Israelites were to wander the desert for another 40 years. But because Joshua and Caleb believed God (*point up to the sky*), they would be the chosen ones to lead the next **generation** of Israelites into the Promised Land after 40 years.

Show teaching illustration: Angry Crowd (Image 08).

#### **POINT TO JESUS:**

**Say:** The Israelites forgot to see how big God is and to trust that He always keeps His promises. It is impossible for us to do things alone. We can be forgiven of our sins when we believe in Jesus and ask God to be in charge of our lives.

**Say:** Let's close in prayer as we wrap up our Bible story time together. Reach your hands up really high.

Reach hands up high.

**Say:** Now clap them together like this.

Clap hands together.

**Say:** Let's pray.

**Pray:** Dear God, You are faithful. Help us to always trust in You even when things seem impossible. We can be reminded of this Bible story and how You always keep Your promises and are bigger than anything we may face. Amen.

#### **SUPPLIES:**

Paper lunch bags (1 per kid), marker, coloring supplies

#### PREP:

Draw a face onto each paper lunch bag (1 per kid).

#### **ACTIVITY INTRO:**

The Bible teaches us true stories about God. Today we learned Moses sent 12 spies to take a look at the Promised Land. Only two of them believed God would still give it to them. The rest were afraid of the people who lived there.



#### **INSTRUCTIONS:**

- **1.** Pass out the paper lunch bags and coloring supplies. Encourage kids to decorate their puppets.
- **2.** Once the kids are done, help them put one hand inside the paper lunch bag and move their puppets around.
- 3. Say: Today we will use some puppets to help us review our Bible story.
- **4.** Ask kids the following questions and encourage them to use their puppet when they answer.

#### 5. Ask:

- Who led the Israelites to the Promised Land?
- How many spies did Moses send to scout out the land?
- What did the spies say about the land? Was it good or bad?
- Who were the two spies who believed the land was good?
- How did the people feel when they heard the 10 spies' report?
- Can we trust God as Joshua and Caleb did?
- What do you think the Promised Land looked like?

#### ~~~~

#### **ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:**

Today we had so much fun with our puppets as we learned about the Israelites and the Promised Land. Remember, just like Joshua and Caleb did, we can always trust God!



#### LEADER TRAINING: A MISSING KID

Have you ever counted your group of kids and had a heart-stopping moment of realizing you don't know where one of them is? Sometimes kids end up in the wrong place, intentionally or unintentionally. Be aware of how many kids are in your group at all times. Count before and after every transition. Don't let any kid go anywhere unaccompanied. Don't panic if a kid is missing. Most often, kids are misplaced, not missing. Calmly follow the next steps without upsetting the other kids in the group. Check other groups, bathrooms and other common areas. Get help and immediately let a leader know if you cannot find a kid. Keep all other kids in place and follow your church's procedures for what happens next.

# **NAVIGATING A BROKEN WORLD:** FEAR OF THE FUTURE

Many preschoolers today may feel a little scared about the future. Though preschoolers aren't thinking too far ahead, they do worry about future moments such as when their parents are coming back or doing something new next week. Studies have revealed that 41 percent of Gen Z fears the future.\* You may experience preschoolers in your group who feel this way sometimes. In today's Bible story, kids will learn that God is always with them. God has a plan and one day will make all things new. Encourage the preschoolers in your



- **6. Say:** Remember, just like we're following each other in this game, we can follow God every day. He's a good leader who loves us and shows us the best way to go!

#### **LEADER TIP:**

Engage kids in today's Bible story by fluctuating the levels of your voice. In the climax of the story, say it louder. In other parts, lower your voice to almost a whisper. By doing so, preschoolers will be captivated and want to hear what happens in the Bible story.

**Say:** When can we trust God? Let's find out more in today's Bible story.

Play the "Find It in the Bible" song.

**Say:** Who can tell me the name of this book? *Allow kids to respond.* 

**Say:** Yes! This book is called the Bible. The Bible is the most important book of all. The Bible is full of true stories about how God takes care of His people and loves them. # THE WALLS OF JERICHO

(JOSHUA 1:1-3; 5:13-6:27)

Gather kids to sit in a huge circle and stand in the middle of the circle.

**Say:** The time had come for the next **generation** of Israelites to enter the Promised Land. Their new leader, Joshua, and the Israelites trusted in God to lead the way. Everyone clap your hands! *Clap and cheer with the kids*.

**Say:** As the Israelites reached the city of Jericho, they saw how strong the walls looked. They were super-tall. It seemed impossible for anyone to get through them. But the Israelites still believed God would lead them.

**Say:** Joshua saw a Man holding a sword. He wasn't just any man; He was the **Commander** of the Lord's army. The **Commander** was God! Joshua instantly fell to the ground and worshipped God. The **Commander** said, "Take your sandals off your feet, for the ground you stand on is holy." Joshua quickly took off his sandals. *Pretend to kick your shoes off your feet.* Show teaching illustration: The Commander (Image 08).

**Say:** God gave Joshua clear instructions on how to win against the city of Jericho. Are all of you ready? Let's stand up on our feet! Joshua was told to march around the city with all his soldiers. You will pretend to be the soldiers. God told the Israelites to march around the city once a day for six days. Let's start marching. Lead the kids marching around the circle. As they complete each circle, count down the days from six to one. If you have a large group, count down the days as kids march for a little bit instead of all the way around the circle.

**Say:** That was a lot of marching! Sit down and get a little rest. Nothing happened to the walls during those six days. But there were more instructions. On the seventh day, God told the Israelites to march around the city seven times.

**Say:** Let's all stand up again! Count down with me as we march around in the circle! 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, 1! The priests blew their trumpets on the seventh lap, and the walls came crumbling down! Lead kids to fall down like the walls. Then stay sitting down. Everyone cheer! Hooray! The Israelites believed God would lead the way, and He did! Show teaching illustration: Walls Crumble (Image 09).

#### **POINT TO JESUS:**

**Say:** God was faithful to the Israelites and led them to victory. God provided victory over sin when He sent Jesus as the Rescuer. Jesus died on the cross for our sins and beat death so we could be made right with God forever.

**Say:** Let's close in prayer as we wrap up our Bible story time together. Reach your hands up really high.

Reach hands up high.

Say: Now clap them together like this.

Clap hands together.

Say: Let's pray.

**Pray:** Dear God, You are faithful. You always keep Your promises. Help us to always trust in You and Your ways. Amen.



## **SAMSON**

BIBLE PASSAGE JUDGES 13-16

**Summary:** God raised up a leader named Samson during a time when the Israelites were oppressed by the Philistines. Samson was dedicated to God from birth, but he also tended to cause trouble and do things his own way. He fell in love with a woman named Delilah. She worked with the Philistines to discover Samson's great strength. The Philistines captured Samson, but God ultimately used him to destroy the Philistine leaders.

## **LEADER TRAINING: BULLYING**

Bullying can be defined as intentional, repeated, or targeted behavior. Unfortunately, churches are not immune to bullying behavior. Have a zero-tolerance policy. We want kids to feel safe at church! Keep your group dynamics positive by shutting down any teasing or meanness, even if you think it is innocent. Keep an eye out for repeated teasing. Kids will pick on other kids. Be aware of anyone who may be a target for being picked on and don't be afraid to intercede. Don't blow off a kid's concerns. If a kid expresses concern, listen and address it immediately. If you discover a larger problem, welcome your ministry leaders and the parents to be part of the conversation and solution.

# NAVIGATING A BROKEN WORLD: HYPOCRITES

A nationwide study titled "Jesus in America" found that more than 50 percent of non-religious Americans view Christians as hypocritical.\* This can be confusing for kids, especially if they see adults whose actions don't match their words. Today's Bible story about Samson is a good way to show that all humans make mistakes. Even the "great heroes of the Bible" still mess up. They were

# Bible TEACHING

**SAMSON** 

**Say:** Yes! This book is called the Bible. The Bible is the most important book of all. The Bible is full of true stories about how God takes care of His people and loves them. Today we will hear a story from the Old Testament in the book of Judges. The Old Testament is filled with lots of stories about the very beginning, God's creation and God's people.

# SAMSON (JUDGES 13-16)

**Say:** God gave incredible strength to a man named Samson. Flex your muscles! From the moment Samson was born, he was chosen to help God's people, the Israelites. The Israelites had entered into the Promised Land. Everyone shout, "Hooray!" But they quickly forgot about following God and His ways. Everyone point up to the sky! *Demonstrate pointing up to the sky*.

**Say:** Enemies would come and take over their new land. The Israelites would call out to God asking for help. God would send a **judge** to help them. Samson was one of these **judges**. But even though Samson was used by God, he didn't always make the best choices. *Shake your finger from side to side*. He tried to do things his way (*point to yourself*) instead of God's way (*point up to the sky*). Let's find out what happened.

**Say:** One day, Samson fell in love with a woman named Delilah. The Philistines, Israel's enemy, wanted Delilah to find out the secret of Samson's strength. They promised her lots of **silver**, or money, if she could find out what would make Samson weak. Raise your hand if you think Delilah is going to help the Philistines.

**Say:** Delilah decided to help them! Oh no, this isn't good for Samson! She nicely asked Samson the secret to his great strength. Samson didn't tell her the truth at first. But soon, he told her (say in a whisper voice), "If you cut my hair, I will be weak." Delilah quickly told the Philistines. Turn to your neighbor and say, "Oh no!"

**Say:** Pretend to sleep. When Samson was sleeping, they cut his hair. Delilah called out for Samson's help, but when Samson jumped up, his strength was gone! Samson's strength had come from God. Without God's power, Samson had no incredible strength. Show teaching illustration: Samson's Haircut (Image 09).

**Say:** The Philistines brought Samson and stood him between two pillars. *Hold up two fingers*. A pillar is a big piece of stone that supports a building. Samson prayed and asked God to give him strength one more time. God answered his prayer! God gave Samson strength one last time, and Samson pushed the two pillars, making the entire building fall. The Israelites were saved from the Philistines!

Show teaching illustration: Samson and the Pillars (Image 10).
