SOLOMON'S WISDOM

BIBLE PASSAGE 1 KINGS 3:3-15; 4:29-34

Summary: David's son Solomon became king, keeping God's covenant with David. Solomon loved the Lord. God appeared to him in a dream, asking what Solomon wanted. Solomon requested wisdom to govern Israel, which pleased God. In addition to wisdom, God promised Solomon riches and honor, emphasizing the importance of following Him. Solomon's reign brought prosperity, wisdom and peace to Israel. He was wiser than any other person. Solomon's reign points toward Jesus, the forever King.

Today's Brite Idea is: Every good gift is from God.

SOLOMON'S WISDOM

LEADER TRAINING: BE PREPARED



One of the best tools to help you teach kids the truth of Jesus is to be prepared. To be prepared, study your lesson beforehand. Setting aside dedicated time to read and review the lesson helps avoid any last-minute prep when kids are arriving. Create a plan or review the plan prepared by the person in charge of your church's kids ministry. This allows you to be focused on engaging with the kids rather than feeling stressed about the activities or what you need to know. Make a point to arrive early and set up your space so each kid has your full attention when they walk through the door.

NAVIGATING A BROKEN WORLD: DEFINING IDENTITY

In a 2019 survey, parents overwhelmingly identified personality and interests as the characteristics that defined their kids' identity.* As preschoolers have first-time experiences growing up, they can struggle with who they want to become and who likes them or wants to be their friend. In this week's lesson, kids will learn about Solomon, who sought after God's wisdom and blessing instead of finding his identity and purpose in his riches or power. As the world tries to define kids and their worth, call

SUPPLIES:

Printable page, scissors (prep)

PREP

Print two sets of the printable pages and cut out. Shuffle the cards thoroughly and arrange them face down in a grid pattern on the playing surface.



LEADER TIP:

Model enthusiasm by sharing your own favorite gift when introducing the activity. It sets the tone for kids to share joyfully!



ACTIVITY INTRO:

Welcome, everyone! My name is _____. Can each of you tell us your name? Welcome each kid by name and welcome any new kids to the group.

INSTRUCTIONS:

- **1. Say:** Today we will play a fun game called "Memory Gift" and talk about some of our favorite gifts. Are you ready?
- **2. Say:** On the table, we have lots of colorful gift cards, but they're all mixed up and face down. Your job is to find two matching gifts!
- **3. Say:** When it's your turn, you'll flip over two cards. If they match, you get to keep them and go again! But if they don't match, we'll flip them back over, and it will be the next friend's turn.
- **4.** Model flipping two cards to show how the game works. Encourage the kids to go one by one.
- **5.** Continue until all pairs are found. Celebrate every match!
- **6. Ask:** What's a gift you've received that you've loved? It could be a toy, something handmade or even a hug or kind words!



ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

You did an amazing job playing "Memory Gift"! You also shared about so many special gifts you've received. Isn't it wonderful to think about how many good gifts we've been given? The Bible tells us that all good gifts come from God, and He loves giving us wonderful things.

OLDER PRESCHOOL SOLOMON'S WISDOM



SUPPLIES:

5 soft balls, 3 baskets

PREP:

Set up a space for tossing the balls into the baskets.



LEADER TIP:

Start by tossing the ball softly to the kids, allowing them to practice before beginning the game.



Brainstorm a few ideas before tossing the ball so kids have examples of God's gifts.

ACTIVITY INTRO:

Welcome, everyone! My name is _____. Can each of you tell us your name? Welcome each kid by name and welcome any new kids to the group.

INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. **Say:** Today we will toss these balls into the baskets.
- **2.** Demonstrate tossing the soft balls into the baskets.
- 3. Say: Every time we toss the ball, let's share something we like that God has given us.
- **4.** Let the kids take turns tossing the balls into the baskets.
- **5. Say:** Great job! God gives us many good gifts to be thankful for!
- **6. Say:** Now we will make it a little bit more challenging! Let's move the baskets farther away from us. We'll see how far we can toss the balls and still get them in the baskets!
- **7.** Move the baskets a few feet away from the kids to increase the challenge.
- **8. Say:** Now you'll need to aim and toss carefully! But remember, every time we toss the ball, say something you like that God has given us.
- **9.** Encourage the kids to try tossing the balls into the baskets from the new distance. Offer help and encouragement to anyone who needs it.



ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

That was a fun game to play together! Today we will learn more about how God gives us gifts. He gave someone named Solomon a very special gift. Let's find out what it is in today's Bible story!

LEADER TIP:

Engage kids in today's Bible story by doing a call and response. Ask questions and encourage kids to follow along with the various movements and activities to help them feel like they are part of the story.

Say: Today we will learn a true story from the Bible about Solomon, David's son. Solomon became king and was given something very special that would set him apart from others.

Say: Let's take a look at this month's Big Question. Can you help me do a drumroll? Ready? One, two, three ... drumroll!





Show the Big Question Teaching Image.

Say: Is anyone or anything wiser than God? We'll learn more about wisdom and the answer to this Big Question in today's Bible story.

Play the "Find It in the Bible" song.

Hold up a Bible.

Say: Who can tell me the name of this book? *Allow kids to respond.*

Say: Yes! This book is called the Bible. The Bible is the most important book of all. The Bible is full of true stories about how God takes care of His people and loves them. Today we will hear a story from the Old Testament in the book 1 Kings. The Old Testament is filled with many stories about the beginning, God's promises to His people and the promised Savior to come.

Bible TEACHING

SOLOMON'S WISDOM

SOLOMON'S WISDOM

1 KINGS 3:3-15; 4:29-34

Say: Today's Bible story starts out with something very exciting. It was time to pick the next king of Israel! Do you think many people wanted to be chosen? Raise your hand if you would want to be picked as the king. Select a kid to be the new king. The new king who was picked was David's son, Solomon. Can you say "Solomon"? Solomon! (Kid's name) will pretend to be King Solomon today. Lead them to stand next to you. Place a crown on the kid's head.

Say: Solomon loved God and followed God's ways. He was going to be a great king! *Have King Solomon give a thumbs-up*. As Solomon went to worship God, God appeared to him in a dream. God asked Solomon a big question. *Stretch your arms out wide*.

Say: God asked Solomon what he wanted and promised that He would give it to him. Wow! Can you imagine God asking you what you wanted and giving it to you? Close your eyes and think about what you might ask for. Open your eyes once you have thought of it! Show teaching illustration: Solomon (Image 07).

Say: Maybe you would ask God for a toy or for help with something or maybe ice cream every day! But Solomon asked God for something that he knew only God could give him. Let's do a drumroll to see what Solomon asked God for! Ready, set, go! *Drum your hands on your legs or the floor along with the kids.*

Say: Solomon asked God for ... have King Solomon shout out, "Wisdom!" Yes, wisdom! Solomon asked God to help him understand right from wrong so he could be a good king over Israel. When you hear the word wisdom in the rest of the Bible story, point to your head.

Say: God was very happy with Solomon's answer. Everyone show me your biggest smile! *Smile big for the kids.* God gave Solomon **wisdom** and understanding! God also gave him riches and **honor**, which means high respect. No other king would be like Solomon.

Say: God encouraged Solomon to always follow Him and His ways. God's ways are the best way to live. Solomon became known for his **wisdom** as many people came to hear him teach. Solomon's wise sayings, or words of **wisdom**, were even written down as part of the Bible! We can read them today in the books of the Bible called Proverbs and Ecclesiastes. Thank the kid who played Solomon and have them sit back down.

Show teaching illustration: Solomon Teaching (Image 08).



SOLOMON'S WISDOM

POINT TO JESUS:

Say: Solomon's wisdom points to the One who is the wisest and greatest—Jesus! Jesus would come from Solomon's family, keeping God's promise to David's family since Jesus is the forever King.

Say: Let's close in prayer as we wrap up our Bible story time together. Reach your hands up really high.

Reach hands up high.

Say: Now clap them together like this.

Clap hands together.

Say: Let's pray.

Pray: Dear God, thank You for giving wisdom. Help us to follow You and remember that no one is greater or wiser than You. Amen.



SOLOMON'S WISDOM



BIG QUESTION

Say: Now it's time to answer our Big Question. Can you all help me do a drumroll? Ready? One, two, three... drumroll!

Show the Big Question Teaching Image.

Say: Is anyone or anything wiser than God? No!

Say: That's right! The Bible teaches us that while God gave Solomon wisdom, God is still the wisest and greatest!



VERSE VIDEO

Play Memory Verse Motion Video after the verse is read.

MEMORY VERSE MOTIONS:

Help kids recite and retain the memory verse by teaching it with motions. Before you teach the verse, be sure to explain what it means.

- God is (point up to the sky)
- a very present (turn around in a circle)

SOLOMON BUILDS THE TEMPLE

BIBLE PASSAGE 1 KINGS 5-8

Summary: The Israelites worshipped God through sacrifices at the tabernacle. King David wanted to build a temple but was told by God that David's son, Solomon, would fulfill this task. Solomon began construction. The temple's design included the Holy Place and housed the ark of the covenant in the Most Holy Place.

God's glory filled the temple. Solomon prayed and thanked God for His presence and acknowledged that He couldn't be contained in a building.

Today's Brite Idea is: God is present.

SOLOMON BUILDS THE TEMPLE

LEADER TRAINING: SAY THEIR NAME



When someone remembers your name, it makes you feel known and special. Kids are no different, so make a point of knowing and saying the kids' names in your group to help create a sense of belonging. As you prepare for the lesson, keep a group list handy and pray for the kids by name each week. Greet kids by saying their names as they walk through the door. It helps to know the parents' names, too. Help families know they are seen and cared for even during busy check-in times. Share how God and Jesus called people by their names in the Bible. There's an amazing sense of love and belonging in knowing that not only does your leader know your name, but God does too.

NAVIGATING A BROKEN WORLD: IS CHURCH IMPORTANT?

Sixty-six percent of Gen Z and millennials who claim to be believers do not attend church even once a month.* With a society that has become more divided, the church has lost popularity in the culture. Kids will range from families who are extremely involved and some who barely attend. Be aware that some kids do not know or understand why church is important. If church is not emphasized in their family, the kids won't know why it should be important to them, too. In today's lesson, Solomon builds a temple for God.

 - In the temple long ago.
 - Now He's with us every day (spread your arms out wide)
 - Here to listen when we pray (put hands together like you're praying)
- **7.** Sing the song again with the hand motions.
- **8. Say:** Today we are learning how God is present. He is with us no matter what!



ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

You did such a great job singing! Remember, just like God was with Solomon when he built the temple, God is always with us too.



SUPPLIES:

LEADER TIP:

Use props, if available, such as a robe or a crown to act out King Solomon.



ACTIVITY INTRO:

The Bible teaches us true stories about God. Today we learned about King Solomon, who built a beautiful temple to worship God. Solomon wanted to honor God with a place to worship Him. We can worship God too!

INSTRUCTIONS:

- **1. Say:** Let's pretend that we're King Solomon! Follow me and do what I do as I walk to the temple to worship God. Are you ready?
- **2.** If using props, put on your pretend crown or robe to act like Solomon and lead the way.
- **3. Say:** I will walk like Solomon, and I want you to follow me. Let's walk carefully and pretend that we're going to the temple to worship God.
- **4.** Line kids up in a single file line behind you. Start walking around your space, encouraging kids to follow you. Change up the movement by adding different actions such as walking slowly, hopping, tiptoeing, marching or making animal sounds as you go.
- **5. Say:** Great job following me! Now, let's pretend we're getting closer to the temple. Let's walk carefully, and when we arrive, we can stop and worship God!
- **6.** Pause the activity at different points and encourage the kids to stop and "worship" by raising their hands, clapping or bowing their heads as if they are praying.
- 7. Ask: What do you think it would be like to worship God in a big, beautiful temple?
- **8. Ask:** What are some ways you can worship God today?



ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

Wow, you did such a great job following me to the temple! And guess what? We can worship God anywhere because He is with us all the time. Just like Solomon wanted a special place to worship God, we can always worship Him too!

SOLOMON BUILDS THE TEMPLE

1 KINGS 5-8

Say: Have you ever wanted to do something important, but it took a long time? That's exactly what happened in today's Bible story. When David was king, he wanted to build a **temple**—a place for people to worship God. David thought this was really important, but God had other plans! God told David he would not build the **temple**. Instead, David's son Solomon would.

Say: Now that Solomon was king, it was finally time for the **temple** to be built! *Hold up the large group printable page*. This is a blueprint or a map of how the **temple** was supposed to be built. The **temple** was not just a regular building; it was a place for worship and for God to be with His people. Everyone point as high as you can up to the sky! *Demonstrate pointing up super-high*.

Say: The **temple** was to be 90 feet long. That's about three school buses lined up! Then the **temple** was to be 30 feet wide. And the **temple** was to be 45 feet high.

Say: Is the **temple** bigger than you thought it would be? *Allow kids to respond*. This **temple** was going to be a lot of work to build! There were also very important and special parts inside the **temple**. These were places where only the priests could go to offer sacrifices to God. There was a spot called the Holy Place where a huge **curtain** separated it from the Most Holy Place. The ark of the covenant was in the Most Holy Place. *Show teaching illustration: Temple Construction (Image 07).*

Say: When the **temple** was finally done, God filled the place with His **presence**. Solomon prayed to God and worshipped God! God was good to keep His promises. God is much bigger and greater than the **temple**, but God came to be in the **temple** to be with His people. Show teaching illustration: Solomon Praising God (Image 08).



SOLOMON BUILDS THE TEMPLE

POINT TO JESUS:

Say: When Jesus went to the cross and died, the curtain that separated the Holy Place from the Most Holy Place was ripped into two. Jesus made a way for us to be forgiven and be with God forever when we believe in Him. God is always with us and always present.

Say: Let's close in prayer as we wrap up our Bible story time together. Reach your hands up really high.

Reach hands up high.

Say: Now clap them together like this.

Clap hands together.

Say: Let's pray.

Pray: Dear God, You are so good! Thank You for always being with us. Help us to always follow and trust in You. Amen.



- **2.** Give each kid a printable page and coloring supplies.
- **3.** Let them color in the temple and the sky with the coloring supplies. Encourage them to use bright colors to decorate!
- **4.** Once they've finished coloring, pass out the cotton balls and show them how to gently pull apart the cotton balls to create fluffy cloud shapes.
- **5.** Place glue onto the sky portion of the page and help kids press their cotton balls onto the glue.
- **6.** Write each kid's name on their paper and set it aside for parent pickup.


DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

- Who was the first king who wanted to build God's big temple, David or Solomon?
- How big do you think the temple was? Was it bigger than your house?
- Who filled the special room in the temple with His presence?
- What are some ways we can show God that we love Him?



PRAY TOGETHER:

Dear God, thank You for being with us always. We know You are present everywhere, and we can worship You anywhere. Amen.



SUPPLIES:

Take-Home page, coloring supplies, building supplies (blocks, cardboard boxes, plastic cups)

PREP:

Print the Take-Home page (1 per kid).



LEADER TIP:

Encourage kids to work together and help each other as they build. Emphasize that building the temple was a team effort, just like their temple!

INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. **Say:** In our Bible story today, we learned that God wanted His people to build a very special temple. Solomon and the people worked together to build it! Today, we will be temple builders too!
- **2.** Encourage the kids to work together to build a temple using the materials provided. If needed, guide them to create a structure, but allow them to be creative.
- **3. Say:** Let's make the temple tall like it was in the Bible story.
- **4.** As the kids build, continue to encourage teamwork and guide them to add special features to their temple, such as a special "holy place" or a spot for worship.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

- Who was the first king who wanted to build God's big temple, David or Solomon?
- How big do you think the temple was? Was it bigger than your house?
- Who filled the special room in the temple with His presence?
- What are some ways we can show God that we love Him?

PRAY TOGETHER:

Dear God, thank You for being with us always. We know You are present everywhere, and we can worship You anywhere. Amen.

ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

Give each kid a Take-Home page. With remaining time, kids can play in centers or color the Take-Home page.

1 KINGS 11-12

Summary: King Solomon was led to worship other gods, despite God's warnings. 

NAVIGATING A BROKEN WORLD: PEER PRESSURE

At this age, they are highly impressionable and may adopt certain toys, activities, or words of others. This can lead to situations where kids feel they need to act a certain way to be included. Leaders can help mitigate this by creating a safe and inclusive environment where everyone is welcome. Lead kids to make independent choices when faced

LEADER TIP:

Keep the pace slow and intentional. Encourage kids to think about God's love as the yarn unravels—use simple language and imagery to help them connect to the idea.

ACTIVITY INTRO:

Welcome, everyone! My name is _____. Can each of you tell us your name? Welcome each kid by name and welcome any new kids to the group.

INSTRUCTIONS:

- **1. Say:** I'm so happy to be here with all of you today! Today we will learn about something amazing—God's love that never ends!
- **2.** Gather kids to sit in a circle.
- **3. Say:** Did you know that God's love never ends? It keeps going and going and going ... just like this yarn!
- **4.** Hold up the ball of yarn for kids to see.
- **5. Say:** I will start unrolling this yarn. As I do, think about how God's love never stops. It's always with us, and it will keep going no matter what!
- **6.** Start unrolling the yarn slowly, calling up different kids to help you unravel it.
- **7. Say:** As we watch the yarn unroll, we can remember that God's love keeps going, no matter what happens! It doesn't stop. It's always there for us, no matter where we go or what we do!
- 8. Ask: How does it make you feel to know that God's love is always there for you?



ACTIVITY INTRO:

Welcome, everyone! My name is _____. Can each of you tell us your name? Welcome each kid by name and welcome any new kids to the group.

INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Say: Today we will play a game called "This or That?"
- **2.** Point to one side of your space and say, "This side is for This!'"
- **3.** Point to the other side of your space and say, "This side is for That!"
- **4. Say:** I'll ask you a question, and you get to pick which one you like better by moving to "This!" side or "That!" side!
- **5. Ask:** Do you like apples or bananas?
- **6.** Kids move to either "This!" or "That!" side.

INTRO:

Play Countdown Video and guide kids to sit together for large group teaching time.

WELCOME:

Say: Welcome, everyone! I am so excited to see you today! We have been learning so much about the Bible together.

RECAP FROM Last Week

Say: First we learned about King David's son Solomon being chosen as the next king of Israel. God told Solomon he could have anything he asked for, and he asked God for wisdom! Solomon was very wise and followed God's ways.

Show teaching illustration: Solomon Teaching (Image 06).

SUPPLIES:

PREP:

LEADER TIP:

Make sure the pieces of paper can easily be ripped into 12 pieces. This will represent the parts of the divided kingdom.

Say: Then we learned how Solomon built the temple and praised and worshipped God. God's glory and presence filled the temple!

Show teaching illustration: Temple Construction (Image 07).

Say: Today we will learn a true story from the Bible about how the kingdom of Israel divided. Even when Solomon didn't follow God's ways, God never gave up on him.

Say: Let's take a look at this month's Big Question. Can you help me do a drumroll? Ready? One, two, three ... drumroll!





Show the Big Question Teaching Image.

Say: Is anyone or anything wiser than God? What do you think? We'll learn more about this question in today's Bible story!

Play the "Find It in the Bible" song.

Hold up a Bible.

Say: Who can tell me the name of this book? *Allow kids to respond.*

Say: Yes! This book is called the Bible. The Bible is the most important book of all. The Bible is full of true stories about how God takes care of His people and loves them. Today we will hear a story from the Old Testament in the book of 1 Kings. The Old Testament is filled with lots of stories about the very beginning, God's promises to His people, and the promised Savior to come.

Bible TEACHING

THE KINGDOM DIVIDES

THE KINGDOM DIVIDES

1 KINGS 11-12

Say: Today's Bible story is sad and disappointing. We have learned about King Solomon and all the great things he did. He followed God and God's ways at first.

Say: But Solomon made a big mistake. He broke his promise to God, and even though he was known for being very rich and **wise**, he made a very unwise choice. God had warned Solomon about not worshipping other gods, but Solomon let others around him worship other gods and eventually he did too.

Say: How do you think this made God feel? *Call on a few kids to answer.* God was angry about Solomon's choice. Solomon had turned away from God! Everyone say, "Oh no!" Because of what Solomon had done, his big, amazing kingdom would be divided. God would keep His promise and keep part of the kingdom for Solomon's son. But the rest of the kingdom would not be Solomon's family's anymore.

Say: Solomon put a man named Jeroboam in charge of all of the kingdom's workers. As Jeroboam was walking along the road, he was stopped by a **prophet**. The **prophet** did something surprising. The **prophet** tore his coat into twelve pieces and gave 10 to Jeroboam! What did this mean? The pieces represented the parts of the kingdom that would be taken away from Solomon's family. Solomon's family would only have the smallest piece, the two remaining parts of the kingdom.

Hold up the 12 pieces of ripped paper. Then count out 10 of the pieces with the kids and place them into one pile.

Show teaching illustration: The Prophet (Image 08).

Say: When Solomon died, his son Rehoboam became king. Rehoboam did not care about the people. Instead, he made them work even harder than his father had and was mean to them. The people rebelled and the kingdom of Israel divided. Rehoboam ruled over two parts, while Jeroboam ruled over the other ten parts. This is exactly what the **prophet** said would happen! Show teaching illustration: Divided Kingdom (Image 09).

Say: Solomon's choice to worship other gods caused a huge divide and bad things. But God was still faithful and kept His promise. God never gave up on loving His people. He promised a forever, perfect King would come.



THE KINGDOM DIVIDES

POINT TO JESUS:

Say: Solomon, the wisest person, sinned and disobeyed God. Jesus came to make us right with God again. Sin separates us from God, but Jesus died on the cross and rose again so we can be forgiven of our sins and be close to God again.

Say: Let's close in prayer as we wrap up our Bible story time together. Reach your hands up really high.

Reach hands up high.

Say: Now clap them together like this.

Clap hands together.

Say: Let's pray.

Pray: Dear God, thank You for never giving up on us even when we mess up. Help us to ask You for forgiveness when we sin and always come back to You. Amen.

Say: Now it's time to answer our Big Question. Can you all help me do a drumroll? Ready? One, two, three... drumroll!

Show the Big Question Teaching Image.

Say: Is anyone or anything wiser than God? No!

Say: That's right! The Bible teaches us that nothing or noone is wiser or better than God. Mark 10:18 says: *No one is good except God alone.*



VERSE VIDEO

Play Memory Verse Motion Video after the verse is read.

MEMORY VERSE MOTIONS:

Help kids recite and retain the memory verse by teaching it with motions. Before you teach the verse, be sure to explain what it means.

- God is (point up to the sky)
- a very present (turn around in a circle)
- help. (extend a hand as if helping someone stand up)

SUPPLIES:

Craft sticks (4 per kid), glue sticks, construction paper (1 per kid), washable stamp pads, baby wipes, coloring supplies, labels

PREP:

Prepare pre-printed labels that say "God never gives up on me" or write it on the top of each construction paper.



INSTRUCTIONS:

- **1. Say:** Today we will make a special picture frame to remind us that God never gives up on us!
- **2.** Give each kid four craft sticks and construction paper to create a frame.
- **3.** Help kids glue the craft sticks together to make a square frame on the construction paper.

BIBLE PASSAGE 2 KINGS 6:8-23

Summary: After the kingdom was divided, Israel and Judah had many kings, most of whom ignored God. The Syrian king tried to capture Elisha, sending a large army to Dothan. Elisha's servant was afraid, but Elisha prayed for God to open his eyes. The servant saw God's army in the mountains. Elisha then prayed for the Syrian

soldiers' blindness and led them to Samaria, where he advised the king to spare them and host a feast instead.

Today's Brite Idea is: God is working, even when we don't see it.

Preschool PERSPECTIVES SURROUNDED

LEADER TRAINING: INCLUDE EVERYONE



Jesus included everyone, even the little kids who seemed like an interruption. To help preschoolers feel like they belong, you must be intentional about including everyone. Include kids in ways in which they feel comfortable. Some preschoolers may be really shy and not want to lead the group or be in the front of the group. Help shy kids be included by partnering them with another kid or asking what they would like to help with. Help kids include one another by modeling asking questions, asking for help for an activity, or even allowing kids to be the greeter when other kids get checked in. By modeling everyone being included, preschoolers can follow your example and work toward including one another.

NAVIGATING A BROKEN WORLD: FEAR

According to recent research, the number of kids struggling with anxiety doubled following the pandemic.* More kids are struggling with social anxiety, phobias, panic attacks and generalized anxiety. Preschoolers in your group are likely struggling with fear. Preschoolers can struggle with fear of the unknown, trying something new or being dropped off and away from their parents/guardians, among other things. In today's Bible story, kids will learn that God is with us even when we are afraid.

PRESCHOOL GLOSSARY:

Chariots: a carriage pulled by horses and used by soldiers

Prophet: a person who gives God's messages to His people

Point to Jesus and share how kids don't have to be afraid; rather, they can find hope and comfort that God is with them.


INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. **Say:** Today we will learn God is always working, even when we don't see it! In our Bible story, there will be someone who sees something important.
- **2. Ask:** How do we see? With our eyes! Let's play a fun game together!
- **3. Say:** I will have you close your eyes. While your eyes are closed, try to guess what's around you!
- **4.** Choose one kid to go first. Have them close their eyes or cover them.
- **5. Say:** Can you tell me what's in front of you? What do you hear? What do you feel?
- **6.** After they guess, uncover their eyes or have them open their eyes.

PLAY FIND IT IN THE Bible Song

Bible TEACHING

ELISHA IS SURROUNDED

Say: Who can tell me the name of this book? Allow kids to respond.

Say: Yes! This book is called the Bible. The Bible is the most important book of all. The Bible is full of true stories about how God takes care of His people and loves them. Today we will hear a story from the Old Testament in the book of 2 Kings. The Old Testament is filled with lots of stories about the very beginning, God's promises to His people.

ELISHA IS SURROUNDED

2 KINGS 6:8-23

Say: Today we are going to learn about someone named Elisha. Can you say that with me? Elisha! Great job! Elisha was a **prophet**, sent to Israel to give God's people a message. Let's see what the message was! *Open up the envelope and pull out the piece of paper*.

Say: The message says to turn back to God and follow His ways! God would also warn Elisha whenever the king of Syria was going to attack Israel. Elisha would then warn the king of Israel so the king was ready when the attacks came!

Say: The king of Syria found out it was Elisha who kept ruining his plans of attack. This made him very mad. Can you show me your best mad face? *Demonstrate a mad face for the kids*. So the king of Syria told his men to find Elisha and take him.

Say: Oh no! This does not sound good for Elisha. Let's see what happens next! When they discovered where Elisha was, the king of Syria sent horses, chariots, and a big army. The place was surrounded! This means there was no way out for Elisha! Can you help me put one color of cups all around my feet? Lead kids to surround your feet with cups. Show teaching illustration: Surrounded (Image 09).

Say: But even in this impossible situation, Elisha was not afraid. Can you say that with me? Elisha was not afraid! Shake your finger no from side to side. Elisha wasn't afraid, but his servant was! Elisha told his servant, "Don't be afraid. Those who are with us are more than those who are against us."

Say: Elisha's servant looked out again at the army that surrounded them, but the servant saw something else! The servant saw another army of horses and **chariots**. It was God's army! God would protect them. Let's make another circle surrounding the first cups! *Lead the kids to put the different-colored cups in a bigger circle around the other cups*.

Say: Elisha prayed that God would keep the Syrian army from being able to see, and God answered his prayer! The Syrian soldiers were not able to see anymore and couldn't fight or take Elisha. Elisha was safe!

Show teaching illustration: Never Alone (Image 10).



ELISHA IS SURROUNDED

POINT TO JESUS:

Say: Even when Elisha was surrounded, God was still with him. God showed His great power and how we can hope in Him. God gives us hope that is greater than anything we might face. We don't have to be alone, because Jesus died on the cross to save us. God is with us and is greater than anything.

Say: Let's close in prayer as we wrap up our Bible story time together. Reach your hands up really high.

Reach hands up high.

Say: Now clap them together like this.

Clap hands together.

SUPPLIES:

Take-Home pages, coloring supplies

PREP:

Print the Take-Home page (1 per kid).

ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS:



Add a hand motion to the activity, like pointing up to the sky while saying "God is working!", to increase engagement.

INSTRUCTIONS:

- **1. Say:** We will play a game called "Trust God!" I'll say a situation where we might not see what God is doing, and you'll say, "God is working!" to remind each other that we can trust Him!
- 2. Say: When it's really dark at night and we're scared, what can we remember?
- **3.** Lead kids to say, "God is working!"
- **4.** Continue with different scenarios:
 - When someone we love needs help, what can we remember? (God is working!)
 - When someone says something mean to us, what can we remember? (God is working!)
 - When we feel alone, what can we remember? (God is working!)
 - When we get hurt, what can we remember? (God is working!)
- **5.** Add some movement to keep it fun:
 - When we're jumping like frogs, what can we remember? (God is working!)
 - When we're spinning around like ballerinas, what can we remember? (God is working!)

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

- Can we always believe God is working?
- Why was Elisha's servant scared?
- What did Elisha's servant see?
- Who is always with us?

PRAY TOGETHER:

Dear God, thank You that even when we can't see it, You're always working. Help me to trust You always! Amen.

ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

Give each kid a Take-Home page. With remaining time, kids can play in centers or color the Take-Home page.

BIBLE PASSAGE ESTHER 2-8

Summary: Mordecai and his cousin Esther were Israelites who were exiled to Persia. When the king needed a new gueen. Esther was chosen. Mordecai urged her to keep her Jewish identity a secret. When Haman wanted to destroy the Jews, Mordecai told Esther to help. He told her that she might be in the palace for this very reason. Though it was risky, she approached the king and revealed Haman's

plan. The king was furious and punished Haman. Esther's brave act saved the Jews.

Today's Brite Idea is: God always has a plan.

LEADER TRAINING: FOLLOW-UP



Be creative in ways you can follow up with kids outside group time. Did they mention something they were looking forward to? Follow up the next time you see them and ask how it went. Write birthday cards, "we miss you" cards, and other notes to the kids in your group. Everyone loves getting mail! Tell parents highlights from your time with the kids. Reaffirm that each kid is valued and wanted in your group. Connect with kids on any of their questions or comments from the week before that need follow-up. Writing down these questions and comments will help you to remember what kids shared. This will help kids feel heard.

NAVIGATING A BROKEN WORLD: DIFFERENT RACES AND RELIGIONS

Reports indicate a 200% increase in antisemitic incidents from 2023 to 2024.* The beginning of conversations about other races and people groups are beginning younger and younger. Preschoolers often notice when kids look different than them. They also sometimes question why another kid might have a different-colored skin tone or hair texture. Encourage kids to see how God created and loves

all people. Remind kids that everyone is created in the image of God regardless of their physical appearance or ability levels. In today's lesson, Esther works to prevent the destruction of the Jews in the land she was living in. Esther stood up for her people even when it was the unpopular thing to do.

OLDER PRESCHOOL ESTHER



SUPPLIES:

Beanbag, music player, upbeat kids' worship song

PREP:

None



LEADER TIP:

For larger groups, set up multiple circles with their own beanbags to keep everyone engaged and give more kids a chance to participate.

OPTIONAL ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS:

Provide noise-canceling headphones for kids who get overstimulated with noise.

ACTIVITY INTRO:

Welcome, everyone! My name is ______. Can each of you tell us your name? Welcome each kid by name and welcome any new kids to the group.

INSTRUCTIONS:

- **1.** Gather kids to sit down in a circle.
- **2. Say:** Let's play a game called "Plan Pass!" I'll play some music, and while it's playing, you'll pass the beanbag around the circle. But when the music stops, whoever is holding the beanbag gets to say, "God always has a plan!" Let's practice saying it together: Lead kids in saying, "God always has a plan!"
- **3.** Turn on the music and have the kids pass the beanbag around the circle.
- **4.** After a few moments, pause the music. The kid holding the beanbag says, "God always has a plan!"
- **5. Ask:** Does anyone know a story in the Bible where God had a plan?
- **6.** Encourage a few kids to share.
- **7.** Repeat several rounds, ensuring different kids get a chance to say the phrase.



ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

That was so fun! And guess what? Just like we said in our game, God always has a plan, even when things seem confusing or don't go the way we expect. We can trust God no matter what! Let's say it together one more time: "God always has a plan!"

OLDER PRESCHOOL ESTHER



SUPPLIES:

Toy scepter, chair

PREP:

Set up a special area for the "king's throne." Place the scepter near the throne. Mark a starting spot where kids will step forward when it's their turn.



LEADER TIP:

If a scepter isn't available, use another fun item, such as a broomstick, paper towel roll or marker.



ACTIVITY INTRO:

The Bible teaches us true stories about God. Today we learned about Esther and how God had a plan for her to be brave and help save her people.

INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Say: In our Bible story, Esther had to be very brave to go before the king. The king had a special rule—he had to hold out his scepter to say it was okay to come in. If he didn't, Esther could have been in big trouble! But Esther trusted that God had a plan for her.
- **2. Say:** Let's play a game where you get to be like Esther! One at a time, you will step forward and say, "God always has a plan!" The king (or leader) will then decide to hold out the scepter and welcome you to sit by the throne.
- **3.** Choose one kid or a leader to be the king and have them sit in the special chair while holding the scepter.
- **4.** Have the first kid step forward and say, "God always has a plan!"
- **5.** The king will hold out the scepter, welcoming the kid to sit nearby.
- **6.** Repeat until all kids have had a turn.
- **7. Ask:** How do you think Esther felt when she stepped in front of the king? Was she scared?
- **8. Say:** Esther was probably a little scared. But she trusted that God always has a plan, even when she didn't know what would happen next.



ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

God had a plan for Esther, and He has a plan for us too. The best part of His plan is that He sent Jesus to make a way for us to be with Him forever!

Bible TEACHING

ESTHER

INTRO:

Play Countdown Video and guide kids to sit together for large group teaching time.

WELCOME:

Say: Welcome, everyone! I'm so happy to be here with you today! We have been learning this month about how God is always with us.

RECAP FROM Last Week

Say: First we learned about King David's son Solomon being chosen as the next king of Israel. God told Solomon he could have anything he asked for, and Solomon chose to ask God for wisdom! Solomon was very wise and followed God's ways.

Show teaching illustration: Solomon Teaching (Image 06).

SUPPLIES:

Bible, teaching slides, teaching pictures (printed/shown from teaching slides), video player, music player, whiteboard, dry-erase marker

PREP:

None

LEADER TIP:

Use the preschool glossary to help familiarize yourself with some preschool language to explain some of the words used in today's Bible story.

Say: Then we learned how Solomon built the temple and praised and worshipped God. God's glory and presence filled the temple!

Show teaching illustration: Temple Construction (Image 07).

Say: Next we learned about how Solomon did not keep his promise to God and how the kingdom he ruled over was divided. Even when Solomon didn't follow God's ways, God never gave up on him.

Show teaching illustration: Kingdom Divided (Image 08).

Say: Then we learned about how God saved the prophet Elisha. Even when an entire army surrounded the city Elisha was in, God made a way and saved Elisha. God is greater than anything and is always working even when we don't see it.

Show teaching illustration: Never Alone (Image 09).

Say: Today we will learn a true story from the Bible about a woman named Esther. She was chosen for a big purpose and would risk everything to try and save her people.

Say: Let's take a look at this month's Big Question. Can you help me do a drumroll? Ready?

One, two, three ... drumroll!



Show the Big Question Teaching Image.

Say: Is anyone or anything wiser than God? Let's find out more from today's Bible story!

Bible TEACHING

ESTHER

Play the "Find It in the Bible" song.

Hold up a Bible.

Say: Who can tell me the name of this book? Allow kids to respond.

Say: Yes! This book is called the Bible. The Bible is the most important book of all. The Bible is full of true stories about how God takes care of His people and loves them. Today we will hear a story from the Old Testament in the book of Esther. The Old Testament is filled with lots of stories about the very beginning, God's promises to His people.

ESTHER 2-8

Say: A woman named Esther lived in Persia with her cousin, Mordecai. Mordecai was like a father to Esther as they lived in this **foreign** land. *Draw a stick figure for Esther and one for Mordecai on the whiteboard*. One day, the king of Persia decided he wanted a new queen. *Draw a third stick figure with a crown*. Esther and some other women were taken to the king's palace to meet him. Introduce yourself to the person sitting next to you. *Demonstrate shaking another kid's hand and saying your name*.

Say: But Esther had a secret she didn't tell anyone. Can you say *shhh*? Esther was a **Jew**. She was a part of God's special family, the Israelites. Out of all the different women who were brought to meet the king, guess who was chosen to be the new queen? *Allow kids to respond*. That's right! Esther was chosen! Everyone shout, "Oh wow!!" *Draw a crown over Esther's stick figure*.

Show teaching illustration: Esther (Image 10).

Say: While Esther's life had just changed in a big way, Mordecai's life was about to be in danger. *Draw a sad face*. An order came from the king for everyone to bow down to Haman, who had just been promoted to be a very powerful worker in the kingdom. But Mordecai refused to bow down to Haman. This made Haman very angry! *Draw a stick figure for Haman with an angry face*.

Say: Then something terrible happened. Haman found out Mordecai was a **Jew** and convinced the king to get rid of all the Jewish people. Now Mordecai's life was in danger and so was everyone who was a **Jew**! *Circle Mordecai's stick figure*.



ESTHER

Say: Mordecai told Esther the terrible news. Mordecai told Esther to go to the king and ask him not to get rid of the **Jews**. *Draw a question mark near Esther's stick figure*. Esther didn't know if she could do this. It was very risky and dangerous to go before the king without being invited. But Mordecai said, "What if you are in the palace for such a time as this?"

Say: Esther asked that all of God's people pray and fast. Esther went to see the king, and he held out his golden **scepter**. This meant Esther could speak to him. Esther had a plan and invited the king and Haman to two feasts. Draw some food. At the second feast, the king asked Esther what she wanted. *Draw more question marks near the king's stick figure.*

Say: Esther shared about Haman's plan for getting rid of all the **Jews**. She asked the king to save her and her family.

Show teaching illustration: Esther's Request (Image 11).

Say: The king was angry! But he wasn't angry at Esther; he was angry at Haman! *Draw an arrow to Haman's stick figure*. Haman was punished, and Mordecai was put in charge of everything. The king wrote a new law to protect all the **Jews**. God's people were saved! *Draw a heart*.

POINT TO JESUS:

Say: God used Esther to save His people. Esther risked her life to save her people. Many years later, Jesus gave up His life to save all people who trust Him. Jesus showed how great and mighty God is and that nothing can stop God's plan.

Say: Let's close in prayer as we wrap up our Bible story time together. Reach your hands up really high.

Reach hands up high.

Say: Now clap them together like this.

Clap hands together.

Say: Let's pray.

Pray: Dear God, thank You for today's Bible story. Help us to know that You always have a plan and are always with us. Amen.



ESTHER



BIG QUESTION

Say: Now it's time to answer our Big Question. Can you all help me do a drumroll? Ready? One, two, three... drumroll!

Show the Big Question Teaching Image.

Say: Is anyone or anything wiser than God? No!

Say: That's right! The Bible teaches us that anyone who tries to outsmart God does not win. God is wiser and greater than anyone, any plan or anything!



VERSE VIDEO

Play Memory Verse Motion Video after the verse is read.

MEMORY VERSE MOTIONS:

Help kids recite and retain the memory verse by teaching it with motions. Before you teach the verse, be sure to explain what it means.

- God is (point up to the sky)
- a very present (turn around in a circle)
- help. (extend a hand as if helping someone stand up)
- Psalm 46:1 (open hands like opening a book)

REVIEW:

Say: It's been so great being with you today, friends! Before we end our teaching time, let's review what we have learned. Let's all point up really high and say, "God has a plan."

Have the kids reach out and say, "We can trust in God's plan."

Say: Now let's point to ourselves and say, "I can trust in God's plan."

SUPPLIES:

Take-Home pages, coloring supplies, printable page

PREP:

Print the Take-Home pages and printable page (1 per kid).

INSTRUCTIONS:



- 1. **Say:** Today we learned that God always has a plan! God had a special plan for Esther. God used her to save His people.
- **2.** Give each kid a printable page and coloring supplies.
- **3. Say:** Let's color in and decorate the four people from today's Bible story: Queen Esther, the king, Mordecai and Haman.
- **4.** Give kids time to color in the four people. Ask them who their favorite person was from the Bible story.
- **5. Say:** At home, ask your parent or an adult to help cut out the four people. You can retell the Bible story from today using your craft!
- **6.** Write each kid's name on their printable page and set aside for parent pickup.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:


- Who had a special plan in our Bible story today?
