

The church can pray for our group by asking God for His continuing guidance, wisdom and peace in every home represented. We ask for God to give the moms the strength to be strong spiritual leaders.







## Women's Bible Study 2026

Curriculum: Remember your Joy by Courtney Doctor & Melissa Kruger



This ten-week Bible study, with an emphasis on biblical theology, traces the promised seed of the woman from Genesis 3:15 through seven Old Testament stories. Each chapter Noah and the ark, Abraham and Isaac, Moses with the manna and water from the rock, the serpent on the pole, Rahab and the spies, David and Goliath, and David and Mephibosheth gives us a glimpse, a foreshadowing, of the greater salvation Jesus wins. The last two weeks we will look at Jesus' birth, the long awaited Messiah.. He is the One, The Joy of our Salvation!

In each encounter, we'll see how God faithfully fulfilled his promise as he prepared us for the ultimate offspring who brought our eternal salvation. 

## Growing Up on Mission: Kayla's Story

Hello! My name is Kayla Henson and I am a TCK/MK (Third Culture Kid / Missionary Kid) who grew up in Birmingham, England. I was four years old when my parents joined the International Mission Board (IMB) and moved us overseas. I lived in England until I turned 18 at which point I decided to return to the States to attend college however, my parents still continue to serve overseas with the IMB.


My parents' work primarily involved planting and revitalising churches. While England was once a country that produced renowned pastors and missionaries, it is now a country that is definitively post-Christian. It's estimated that every week in England five churches close permanently, most of which often become mosques or Hindu temples. The city we served in, Birmingham, boasted a population of 4.5 million with less than 1% being evangelical Christian. England is certainly a vast yet tough field.

Growing up on the mission field exposed me to several unique experiences that I believe helped to shape me into the person I am today. I had the opportunity to witness God at work in ways that I probably never would have seen otherwise and was blessed to witness first hand the transformative power of the Gospel.

I would say that there were several lessons that the Lord taught me while growing up on the mission field however, one that immediately comes to mind is thankfulness. It was never lost on me that almost everything I had in my life was provided by the generosity of others. My family's house, car, electricity, water, and salary was provided for by the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering. Growing up I knew that we couldn't do the work we were doing without the servant-heartedness of others and found myself moved to show the same generosity that people had shown me.

As I previously mentioned, my parents continue to serve with the IMB however, in May 2024 they moved to Dublin, Ireland. Ireland has a population of 5.3 million, about the same as South Carolina, however, only 0.3% of the population are evangelical Christian making Ireland the most unreached English speaking country in the world. There are only 33 Baptist churches in all of Ireland compared to South Carolina which has 2,000. Furthermore, Ireland has stopped issuing missionary visas making it far more difficult to get missionaries into the country. However, God has been at work in Ireland! A few weeks ago my parents celebrated the baptism of an Irish national! So if you would, please keep both Ireland and England in your prayers along with my parents, Kenny and Kristy Dubnick. Pray that God would continue to strengthen my parents as they go about His work. Pray that God would continue to advance His kingdom in Ireland! Thank you!

Kayla and her husband, Ty, are currently in our Establish Network Residency.

Nehemiah Teams is an 8-week summer mission opportunity for students ages 17-29 which strategically involves them in crosscultural missions among unreached people groups. As a program of the International Mission Board (IMB), NT partners with IMB personnel and other global Christians, connecting with state conventions, local Southern Baptist associations & churches to reach the unreached & hard to reach.

The Bible says that one day as Jesus was walking along the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon called Peter and his brother Andrew... and he said to them, "Come follow me, and I will send you out to fish for people." The Bible says, that, "At once they left their nets and followed him." Not knowing... exactly where... exactly what, but in this small step of obedience, they stepped into The Story, and the rest is history.

We would like to invite you to step into His Story this summer by joining Nehemiah Teams! For 2 months, you can share the gospel among the unreached in rural areas or urban centers. You can explore the South Pacific islands, helping find unengaged, unreached people groups, including the deaf. Use your skills or interest in media, basketball, skateboarding or agriculture to take the gospel to those who have never heard.

You will be trained and challenged for 4 days in Alabama with many other students. Your team will leave directly from orientation for your assignment. After your deployment, your summer will end with a 2-day debrief in Alabama.

A summer with Nehemiah Teams will not be easy. Don't come unless you are willing to pick up your cross and, like those first disciples, leave your nets. If you come this way... empty-handed... God will use you and will use this summer in you! See you in June!
