FOREVER KING

BIBLE PASSAGE MICAH 5:1-5

Summary: God sent prophets to warn the Israelites about their rebellion but also to tell them about a future Messiah. Micah told the Israelite leaders they were wrong for mistreating the poor and that their enemies would capture them. He also told them God was going to send a King who would rule forever and would be born in the town of Bethlehem. Bethlehem was not a prominent town, but it would be the birthplace of the Messiah. Micah's prophecy pointed toward Jesus coming to save the people from their sins.

Today's Brite Idea is: God promised a Savior who would be King forever.



NAVIGATING A BROKEN WORLD: ETERNAL LIFE

33 percent of Americans surveyed believe in reincarnation. Roughly 25 percent do not believe in any kind of afterlife at all.* Movies, shows and other media offer kids many differing views of what happens when we die. Kids may be confused about the truth as they see different things in media or are told that everyone goes to heaven or that someone will receive another life as a person or creature. Other prominent religions teach that

salvation must be earned. Kids may be confused about what is true and what God says will happen. In this month's lessons, kids will learn that Jesus is our forever King who made a way for them to know they can live with God for eternity. Point preschoolers to the truth that Jesus is the only way to have eternal life. Though eternal life may seem hard for preschoolers to understand, start to help them build the foundation of the truth that Jesus can be their king forever.

ADAPTATION FOR DIFFERENT LEARNERS:

For active learners, strategically place the kids in the circle next to a positive model. Remind kids of criss-cross applesauce or provide a chair if needed.

INSTRUCTIONS:

- **6.** Play music as you say, "Pass the crown!" to get them started passing the crown around the circle.
- **7.** Stop the music after a few seconds.
- **8. Ask:** Who has the crown? Whoever has it, have them hold the crown above their head. Let's all say together, "Jesus is the forever King!"
- **9. Say:** Let's keep playing! Pass the crown again!
- **10.** Repeat the game several times, ensuring every kid has a chance to hold up the crown.



ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

You all did a great job passing the crown and remembering that Jesus is our forever King. Just like we passed the crown, we can share the good news about Jesus with others! God promised a Savior who would be King forever. Let's give Jesus a big cheer: "Hooray for our forever King!"

FOREVER KING

MICAH 5:1-5

Say: In today's Bible story there is bad news that is shared and then really good news! What news do you want to hear first? *Allow kids to respond*.

Say: Let's hear the bad news so that we can celebrate at the end what the good news is! There was a **prophet** named Micah. Micah had to deliver some bad news to God's people. Turn to your neighbor and say, "bad news."

Say: Micah told the people they were not following God's ways. They were disobeying God and not treating people right. Everyone show me a thumbs down. *Demonstrate a thumbs down*.

Show teaching illustration: Micah (Image 07).

Say: Micah wanted them to change and follow God's ways again. God's ways directed people on how to live and treat one another right. Everyone point up to the sky!

Say: Now for the good news. Turn to your neighbor and say, "good news!" Micah also had some very good news to share! Everyone show me a thumbs up! *Demonstrate a thumbs up.* Micah promised the Israelites that a King would come who would rule forever. This was the promised **Messiah**! Any guesses on who you think the **Messiah** is? *Allow kids to respond.* That's right, the promised **Messiah** is Jesus! Jesus would be the forever King.

Say: This was a very big promise for God to make to His people. This promise meant the Ruler would always be there! This Ruler would be different than the other people who had ruled because this wasn't just another regular king. This promised King was Jesus...God's Son!

Say: Micah told the Israelites that this forever King would take care of God's people. He would help them and comfort them. How exciting! Let's say the good news together. "Jesus is our forever King!" Ready? 1...2...3! Jesus is our forever King! Let's say it one more time! Jesus is our forever King!

Show teaching illustration: Forever King (Image 08).

POINT TO JESUS:

Say: Jesus is the forever King. Jesus has always existed and always will. Everyone needs Jesus, as it's only through Him that we can be saved from our sins. Jesus can be the King of our lives and we will live forever with Him.

Say: Let's close in prayer as we wrap up our Bible story time together. Reach your hands up really high.

Reach hands up high.

Say: Now clap them together like this.

Clap hands together.

Say: Let's pray.

Pray: Dear God, thank You for sending Jesus to be the forever King. Help us to remember that You always keep Your promises. Amen.





LEADER TRAINING: PREPARATION AND SUCCESS



Preschoolers are naturally curious and full of joyful energy, but their level of engagement in a lesson is directly tied to our level of preparation. Kids respond with focused interest and excitement when we come in prepared—knowing the Bible story, having materials ready, and anticipating transitions. They feel our confidence, and it creates a structured, engaging environment where they can learn and thrive. On the other hand, distractions threaten to take over when we're unprepared. Searching for supplies, fumbling through the lesson or figuring things out on the spot makes it hard to keep their attention. Preschoolers sense when we're not ready, and it becomes difficult to keep them engaged. Preparation is an act of love and stewardship. Let's be intentional in our preparation so that every moment with our preschoolers is one of meaningful, impactful engagement!

NAVIGATING A BROKEN WORLD: NEGATIVE NEWS MEDIA

Our culture thrives on 24/7 news coverage. In a recent study, two-thirds of kids said that "consuming news makes them feel smart and knowledgeable." * Even if the kids in your group aren't watching the news, the adults in their world likely are. Unfortunately, today's culture emphasizes negative news reports. All of this negativity can paint a very hopeless picture for kids. There may be kids in your group who are

worried about what is happening in the world or even feel hopeless. Kids will learn about Mary and Joseph receiving some very unexpected news. However, this news would bring hope into our dark world. - **9.** Play a few rounds, adjusting the difficulty level based on the group's energy and understanding.

Say: The visitor who came to see Mary was not just anyone. It was an angel named Gabriel! Gabriel said, "Greetings, **favored** one!" "The Lord is with you!" What could this all mean? Let's find out more!

Show teaching illustration: Mary (Image 07).

Say: Mary was very surprised! On the count of three, let's jump up in surprise. Ready? 1, 2, 3... JUMP! Now why would an angel come see her? She was just a normal person. But what she was about to find out was she had been chosen for something big!

Say: Gabriel said, "Don't be afraid. You have found **favor** with God." You will have a Son and are to name Him Jesus. He is God's Son and will rule forever. Everyone say "wow" with me! "Wow!" Mary was going to have God's Son.

Say: When Joseph heard the news, he did not understand what God was doing yet. An angel appeared to Joseph in a dream. 



NAVIGATING A BROKEN WORLD: WHAT IS CHRISTMAS ABOUT?

His friends are focused on gifts, lights and the Christmas play, and it all feels very commercial to Charlie Brown. He exclaims, "Isn't there anyone who knows what Christmas is all about?" His best friend Linus steps in, quoting Luke 2, sharing about the birth of Jesus. Our culture loves the superficial parts of Christmas but doesn't celebrate the true

reason for the holiday. Preschoolers are likely to focus on the many other parts of the Christmas season and not just that it's about Jesus. Preschoolers are at the age of believing in Santa. During this lesson, you can help kids learn that the very best thing to happen to us is the whole reason we celebrate Christmas. Encourage them to celebrate with you!

- 1. Divide the kids into two teams. Select a leader for each group and have them stand away from their team. Give each leader a die.
- 2. Say: Mary and Joseph had to travel to be counted; we will play a game to see who can make it to their team leader first.
- **3. Say:** Your team leader will roll the die. The number it lands on will tell us how many steps your team is able to take. The team that reaches their leader first, wins!
- 4. Say: When you reach your leader, everyone shout, "Jesus is the promised Savior!"
- **5.** Lead the kids in playing the game. Select a different leader and play several rounds as time allows.

ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

Mary and Joseph journeyed to Bethlehem where baby Jesus was born. This birth fulfilled the promise God said of a Savior coming. Many celebrated that the Savior was here!

OLDER PRESCHOOL JESUS IS BORN



SUPPLIES:

2 buckets, 3 balls, painter's tape

PREP:

Tape a starting line with the painter's tape. Place one bucket in front of the other a few steps away from the starting line.



LEADER TIP:

After each round, challenge kids by placing the buckets farther away from them.



ACTIVITY INTRO:

Welcome everyone! My name is _____. Can you each tell us your name? Welcome each kid by name and welcome any new kids to the group.

INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. **Say:** Let's play a game! We will stand behind this line and try to throw our ball into the buckets. If you make it in, tell me your favorite thing Christmas decoration or activity.
- 2. Demonstrate the activity to the kids.
- 3. Gather the kids to stand in a single file line behind the starting line.
- **4.** Lead the kids to toss the balls into the buckets. Celebrate with them, whether they make it or not.
- 5. Repeat until every kid has had a few turns or time runs out.



ACTIVITY WRAP-UP:

Wow, you all did an amazing job with the ball toss! I loved seeing how well you played together and cheered each other on. Today we will learn another Bible story and learn about how people celebrated something big. Let's learn what happened together.

SUPPLIES:

PREP:

Lay out a baby doll, blanket, and basket where you will teach the Bible story.

LEADER TIP:

Some kids may think they know this Bible story by heart. Encourage those who may already know this Bible story to help you teach it or listen for anything they may not have known happened in the Bible story.

Say: Then we learned about Mary and Joseph finding out they would have a Son and were to name Him Jesus. The angel told them Jesus would be the Savior and be God's Son! Show teaching illustration: Mary (Image 07).

Say: Today, we will learn a true story from the Bible about when Jesus was born.

Say: Let's take a look at this month's Big Question. Can you help me do a drumroll? Ready? 1, 2, 3 drumroll!





Show the Big Question Teaching Image.

Say: Is God faithful in keeping His promises? We will find out more about this question in today's Bible story!

Play the "Find It in the Bible" song.

Hold up a Bible.

Say: Who can tell me the name of this book? *Allow kids to respond.*

Say: Yes! This book is called the Bible. The Bible is the most important book of all. The Bible is full of true stories about how God takes care of His people and loves them. Today we will hear a story from the New Testament in the book of Luke. The New Testament is filled with lots of stories about Jesus' birth, life and what happens afterward.

Bible TEACHING

JESUS IS BORN

JESUS IS BORN

LUKE 2:1-21

Say: Today's Bible story starts with a big journey. The **emperor** of Rome had sent out a message for everyone to travel back to their hometowns to be counted. Mary and Joseph had to travel back to **Bethlehem**. But Mary was really close to having baby Jesus! And it would take a few days to get there!

Say: There weren't any cars (beep beep!), trains (choo-choo!) or airplanes (swoosh!) to get there quickly. Instead, they would walk and Mary may have ridden on a donkey. The journey would last four to five days! Let's count together...1, 2, 3, 4, 5! Can you imagine walking for that long? *Allow kids to respond*.

Say: Finally, they made it! Everyone say, "They made it!" Mary and Joseph arrived in **Bethlehem**. Though the journey was over, Mary was about to have baby Jesus and there was no place for them to stay!

Say: They stayed where the animals were kept. Make your best animal noise. Ready, set, go! Make animal noises along with the kids. After Jesus was born, Mary gently wrapped Him in a cloth and laid Him in a **manger**. Demonstrate wrapping the baby doll with a blanket and lay the babydoll down in a basket for kids to see.

Show teaching illustration: Mary, Joseph, and Baby Jesus (Image 08).

Say: Nearby, shepherds were in a field watching over their sheep. *Make circles with your hands and hold them over your eyes like pretend binoculars.* What sound does a sheep make? Baaa! Then, all of a sudden an angel appeared to the shepherds. The angel said, "Don't be afraid! I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. In this city, a Savior has been born. He is Christ the Lord. You will find Him wrapped in cloths and lying in a **manger**."

Say: Suddenly, the sky was filled with so many angels. They were praising God and saying, "Glory to God! Peace on Earth!" The shepherds could not just stay in the field after this. They rushed to find Mary, Joseph, and Baby Jesus. They found them, just as the angels had said. Show teaching illustration: Shepherds and Baby Jesus (Image 09).



JESUS IS BORN

POINT TO JESUS:

Say: Baby Jesus would grow up and make a way for us to be with God forever by dying on the cross and rising again. The birth of Jesus was great joy for God kept His promise and sent the Savior.

Say: Let's close in prayer as we wrap up our Bible story time together. Reach your hands up really high.

Reach hands up high.

Say: Now clap them together like this.

Clap hands together.

Say: Let's pray.

Pray: Dear God, thank You for sending Jesus just as You promised. Help us to trust in Him and share the good news with others. Amen.



ANNA AND SIMEON

Say: Have you ever wanted something really bad? Maybe it was wanting a new toy or a treat or for someone you love to be okay. Today we will learn about a man named Simeon who wanted to see the promised Savior, Jesus, before he died.

Say: Simeon followed God and knew of God's promise to send Jesus. He had been waiting and waiting and waiting for the promise to come true. Simeon didn't give up. He didn't lose his faith. Instead, he trusted that God would keep this promise.

Say: One day, Mary and Joseph took Jesus to Jerusalem to present Him to God and offer a **sacrifice** to God. Simeon, who only wanted to see Jesus, also lived in Jerusalem! God led Simeon to the **temple** where Jesus was. Simeon was overjoyed! He took Jesus in his arms and praised God. Simeon was so thankful He was able to see Jesus! Simeon said, "Jesus is the Savior for the whole world!" Simeon knew that Jesus had come for everyone. Show teaching illustration: Simeon (Image 09).

Say: Another person came to see Jesus; this person was named Anna. Anna was a **prophet**, a special messenger of God. Anna loved God very much and followed Him. She worshiped at the temple every day and night, never leaving. She, like Simeon, also really wanted to see God's promise come true and meet the promised Savior.

Say: When Anna met Jesus, she praised God. Anna quickly told others the good news: the promised Savior has been born! Turn to the kid sitting next to you and say, "The promised Savior was born!" Now can you say it in a whisper voice? "The promised Savior was born!" How about in a super loud voice? "The promised Savior was born!" What amazing news! Show teaching illustration: Anna (Image 10).
