"Deep Roots, Strong Limbs" is said often within our ministry. Our College ministry is rooted in a deep desire to see students grow into mature disciples of Jesus Christ. We operate with the understanding that these young adults are not only the church of tomorrow but an integral part of the church today. We aim to prepare college students to be leaders; active participants now and in their next church, business, family and beyond. Our prayer is that every student leaves this ministry rooted in Christ, equipped to serve, and sent; ready to impact the world for the Kingdom of God.

The Gathering is a cornerstone of Taylors College Ministry, offering young adults a mid-week opportunity to connect deeply with one another and with the Lord. This service creates space for vibrant community, intentional corporate prayer and worship, with scriptural preaching in an expository style. It's ultimately a mid-week break for young adults to have a pause on the week and be encouraged for the journey. The Gathering utilizes students to serve with hospitality, check-ins, media, worship, and guest follow up. Currently, Alex Smith, Minister of College, is preaching through Galatians.



Life Groups are an integral part of Taylors College Ministry, providing college students with a weekly opportunity to grow in their faith through small, intentional communities. Our Life Group is comprised of small groups at tables that focus discussion on the current sermon series. We love this approach as it helps us reiterate and continue the conversation of what is being taught during services on Sunday mornings at Taylors FBC. This has been a great success with the help of adult guides that sit at these tables and help carry the conversation. The role of these table guides is to assist in hosting the table discussions. Alex presents, answering questions as needed, and gathering prayer requests for the week. No lesson planning is required. We do ask for additional help on Sundays with Big Breakfast, setting up coffee, and other small hospitality measures. Converge is a cornerstone event for our college ministry that is held in the winter in partnership with the South Carolina Baptist Collegiate Ministry (SCBCM). We are grateful for the encouraging growth God has given, which we attribute to His mercy and the faithful, consistent presence of our church family. These gatherings remind our students that they are truly welcomed and loved, and they provide valuable testimony as we seek to prepare them for faithfulness in church, work, family, and beyond.



Chapel Leroy

Taylor's College Ministry is excited to highlight Chapel Leroy. Chapel is a student at North Greenville University where he is earning a Bachelor of Arts in Youth Ministry. A few years back, Chapel felt the Lord's prompting in a call to ministry. Chapel has been part of Taylor's College Ministry since 2023 when he attended the Teach Reach Beach evangelism retreat. Please see below for an update from Jared and Danika*, who recently stayed in one of our Ministry Homes.




During the turn-around process, we have been delayed going to the field twice due to medical clearance. Though, it currently looks like we will be able to return in June.




Making Birthdays Special: WMU Partners with Miracle Hill Ministries

Monthly Prayer for Unengaged Unreached People Groups

A UUPG is a distinct cultural or language group with no known active church-planting strategy or missionary presence, and less than 2% evangelical population. The IMB (International Mission Board) estimates there are over 3,000 such groups, comprising about 290 million people who lack access to the Gospel.

The red on the portion of the world map above indicates where UUPGs can be found. Where do you see the greatest concentration of Unengaged Unreached People Groups?

If you said South Asia, you are right! The South Asia Affinity is comprised of seven nations — Pakistan, India, Nepal, Bangladesh, Bhutan, Maldives, and Sri Lanka.

This is why Taylors First Baptist has made an effort to specifically target South Asia. It doesn't mean other places aren't important. They are! But we also recognize that while South Asia has the greatest concentration of lostness on the planet, it also receives the smallest percent of laborers to population.

For the month of March, we ask that you pray over the Charodi people group of India.

The Charodi are an unengaged, unreached people group located in the Karnataka districts of Shimoga, Uttara Kannada and Dakshina Kannada, numbering 4,800. Their primary language is Konkani, but they speak Kannada to those outside their home. Their primary religion is Hinduism.

The word "Charodi" means "Four boats" in Konkani, which perhaps explains that their ancestors had fled Goa in four boats. Or another version states that the word "Charodi" is the short form of "acharwadi" which means "settlement of carpenters." The Charodi are traditionally carpenters, primarily boat-makers, and are primarily still in that occupation today.



Pray that the Charodi would hear the story of a carpenter, a carpenter who stepped down from heaven to live a life on earth that they themselves cannot live. A humble, sacrificial carpenter who sacrificed his very self, to carry the weight of the punishment of the sins of the Word. A carpenter who was also very familiar with boats – who awoke from slumber during a storm at sea to display his great power by causing the wind and storm to cease and the seas to still. A former carpenter who will one day return as Judge and Ruling King. May the Charodi see their need for a Redeemer and put their faith in Christ as Lord and Savior, that they themselves might become fishers of men amid their carpentry community.

Our Story

It is estimated that there are nearly 42,000 lost people living within 3 miles of the walls of our church who are in desperate need of a Savior. We are committed to engaging this community with the good news of the gospel, and every week we seek to do that through our Time in the Harvest. On Thursdays, a small group of volunteers gathers for a brief time of prayer and preparation before going out in groups into neighborhoods surrounding our church. As we go, we are praying for each community, asking God to move in a mighty way so that His glory will be made known throughout Taylors. We are also asking Him to direct our steps and place people in our path who are open to hearing the gospel. As we meet new people, our goal is to clearly present the gospel using the "3 Circles" tool. As the gospel is faithfully proclaimed and seeds are planted, we trust that the Holy Spirit will do His work in softening the hearts of those who have heard.

Our Challenge

One challenge that we face is the need for more boldness when we go out and try to talk to people that we've never met. Our boldness can sometimes falter when we experience rejection or people seem disinterested. However, it is always important to remember that the Lord is with us and goes before us. He is our strength, and He is the one who guides our steps and our words. Another challenge is people's unwillingness to take the next step to surrender their lives to Jesus. Many are friendly and willing to listen as we share, but there is oftentimes a reluctance to make a commitment. In cases like this we exchange contact details and attempt to follow up, but it can be very challenging to reconnect.

Prayer Requests

- Pray for divine appointments and open hearts as we meet people in the community.
- Pray for the Holy Spirit to empower and embolden us to share the Gospel.
- Pray that the Lord would raise up more laborers for this important work.
- Pray for follow-up conversations and discipleship opportunities with those whom we are meeting as we engage the community.



Chef Blakely brings 25 years of faithful service as Director of Food Ministry and Chef at First Presbyterian Church Greenville.


His experience also includes serving as a Culinary Arts Instructor for Spartanburg District


